Vicar's Letter

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia

An educated, highborn Hindu was rehabilitated at a leprosy mission hospital. He boasted that even if he was brought back from death to life he would never become a Christian. One night, after reading a gospel booklet to a little boy in the hospital, all that changed. God spoke so clearly to him and he accepted Jesus as his Saviour and soon after he was baptised. He then changed his name to that of Lazarus - the one who was 'brought back from death to life'! The resurrection is like that, it has a way of turning people's lives and circumstances upside down. A way of bringing new life and new hope where previously there was none.


The reality or otherwise of the resurrection has been a subject that has occupied the thoughts of many people through the centuries. Several explanations have been suggested over the years. Some have suggested that he wasn't really dead and revived in the coolness of the tomb. Others that it was a myth spread by the disciples. When exposed to scrutiny, however, they all fall apart.

One of the more recent books to address this question was written by Frank Morrison in the 1930's. It was called "Who Moved the Stone". The first chapter is entitled "The book that refused to be written" and is a very telling title. The book he set out to write was one intended to demolish all the arguments supporting the resurrection. He firmly believed that if someone really examined the evidence with a critical eye the myth of the resurrection would soon become apparent.

That is the book that refused to be written. The more Morrison examined the evidence the more he became convinced that if he really followed the evidence that book could not be written. The book he did write – on the basis of the evidence – was that Jesus Christ did rise from the dead.

Many before and since Morrison have come to the same conclusion in their own personal experience as the risen Christ has touched and changed their lives.

BARTON MILLS BAPTIST CHURCH



Many years ago, I was fascinated to read the following article in a devotional booklet. I thought it would bear repeating, especially as **Sir Alexander Fleming lived in Barton Mills from 1921 to 1955.** I hope you will find it as interesting as I did and think seriously about what it tells us.

A gathering of friends at an English estate nearly turned to tragedy when one of the children strayed into deep water. The gardener heard the cried of help, plunged in and rescued the drowning child. That youngster's name was Winston Churchill. His grateful parents asked the gardener what they could do to reward him. He hesitated, then said, "I wish my son could go to college some day and become a doctor". "We'll see to it," Churchill's grateful parents promised. Years later, while Sir Winston was Prime Minister of England, he was stricken with pneumonia. The country's best physician was summoned. His name was Alexander Fleming, the man who discovered and developed penicillin. He was also the son of that gardener who had saved young Winston from drowning. Later Churchill remarked, "Rarely has one man owed his life twice to the same person".

During this month at Easter, we are reminded how much God loved us when He sent His only Son, the Lord Jesus, to intervene on our behalf. He was crucified and left for dead, removed from the cross and put in a borrowed grave. On the third day He rose from the dead, saving us at great cost to Himself. If skeptics had questioned Jesus after His resurrection, all He would have had to do is show them His bruised, nail pierced hands. They are ample proof that He has given Himself for each one of us. What have you done with God's love? Have you accepted the sacrifice of His Son on the cross for your sins? It's not enough just to know about it. You must say from your heart, "He died for me!"

The deadline for registering to vote is Monday 17th April

NATURE NOTES.......In mid-April we can hope to hear the cuckoo, surely the one bird call that everyone recognises. It is one of our fastest declining migrants. Tracking studies by the British Trust for Ornithology showed that one individual travelled more than 50,000 miles to and from Suffolk in five years. It is now known that cuckoos coming to UK to breed take two different routes from the Congo Basin and across the Sahara. After such a journey, at least they don't have to make a nest and raise their own young. After mating, the female lays her eggs in the nests of a smaller species such as dunnock, meadow pipit, pied wagtail or reed warbler, whose own young are often pushed out when the cuckoo hatches and is reared by the foster mother.

At Eastertide, many people like to place flowers on the graves of loved ones. To avoid disappointment, don't buy primroses, primulas, tulips or roses - these would soon be munched by muntjac deer. Daffodils are safe. It isn't the fault of the deer that they were introduced from China and in the past hundred years have spread through much of England.


