Vicar's Letter

FREEDOM DAY!!

That seemed to be the banner headline yesterday as we entered the first day after all the government restrictions were lifted. Free to do things as we wish without the fear of breaking the law as far as COVID is concerned. And the sun shone all day so many felt that it was a good day! However, as is always the case, with freedom comes responsibility. Does what we want to do impact on other people? Will our actions make them more vulnerable? Do our actions and wishes make it more difficult for others to keep safe? Particularly those who are more vulnerable health-wise than us? It can sometimes be difficult to see where our actions impact on others but the government has called on us all to take that responsibility seriously and think carefully before we act or do something.

The same is true for corporate bodies, businesses, voluntary organisations and indeed churches. We, as churches, have a further command to hold on to. Jesus told his disciples to "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind and with all your strength" (or this could say with all your resources, all you have). He also said "Love your neighbour as yourself". We are holding these instructions from Jesus very much in our minds as we consider the way forward for St Mary's Church and the others in the Lark & Lee Group. We do need to move forward at this point but we also need to have in mind that there are many who still feel very vulnerable and fearful about the future, many who have rarely been out of their homes for months.

So, we will move forward in our churches but cautiously. For the time being we will ask people to continue to wear facemasks when they are moving around in church and also when we are singing (yes, we can do that again now! but there is a greater risk of transmitting the virus when we sing). We will also continue to use hand sanitiser. Whilst some of the seating will be back to how it was before the pandemic there will also be "socially distanced" seating for those who would like use it. We will consider other changes in due course when we have had time to hear what our worshippers think and feel. All are welcome to worship with us at any of our services (details elsewhere in this edition) but I hope that all who come will be guided by those words from Jesus when they are with us in church in considering others fears and vulnerabilities. I look forward to seeing you!



On 23 July hundreds of the world's best athletes will be gathering in Tokyo for the Olympic Games. It's taken them years of practice to get to the peak of condition. Many hours of patience, pain and loneliness have been experienced and sacrifices have been endured. Some of them may only reach the first round of their event, however, all will have run the race of their lives and have taken part in one of the world's largest sporting events. The winner's dreams of standing on the rostrum holding their medals aloft in front of millions of people around the world have been realized.

We are in a race of life and we hit many walls of pain, loneliness, hopelessness and sadness but if we, like Paul tells us in Hebrews 12 v 1&2..."run with patience the race that is set before us, looking unto Jesus", we shall overcome. Running the Christian race is not always easy. High mountains may stand in our way as we continue on the course God has marked out, but if we keep our eyes on the goal by "looking unto Jesus" we will not stray from the path He has outlined.

May we fix our eyes on the eternal goals set before us and keep looking unto Jesus. The apostle Paul said, "So run that ye may obtain" (v24) - He meant, run to win! One of our hymns says:

Run the straight race through God's good grace, lift up thine eyes and seek His face Life with its path before us lies, Christ the Way and Christ the Prize.

GOOD NEIGHBOUR SCHEME

- we continue to offer help

During June and July, we have been very busy with requests for assistance and our volunteers have rallied round to ensure that we have been able to meet the needs of our neighbours. With the mix of wet and then warm weather, gardens have gone green in ways that nature but not residents intended. Our volunteers have tackled a number of gardens where weeds and long grass have come to dominate and challenged the ability of some of our villagers to be able to keep on top of maintaining their proudly laid out and landscaped curtilages. We have been able to undertake one-off tidy-ups that have restored such gardens to a level whereby owners have once more been able to keep them trim, either by themselves or by then arranging with a commercial gardener or family member to undertake regular maintenance.

As always, our advert in this magazine sets out a list of support services that we most commonly offer to provide but we would also encourage villagers in need to contact us to discuss whether we might be able to assist them in ways that are not specifically listed. We don't offer commercial services and are not able to provide electrical, gas, plumbing or central heating services for which professionally qualified and certified tradespeople/companies must be engaged. Our voluntary services are, in the main, one-off jobs or short-term support but we also provide longer-term befriending that promotes friendship and neighbourliness for all involved. This has become more important for a number of our neighbours and an increasing number of our volunteers have been happy to offer their friendship in this way. Such visits for chats have greatly benefitted all concerned, both the villagers looking for such befriending and those volunteers who have now found interesting friendships with those people that they visit.

The Good Neighbour Scheme remains firmly in place to continue its work to ensure that the community is supported when and where needed as we move forward from the end of most of the COVID-19 restrictions. We again wish to remind Barton Miller readers that we are able to provide our services not only in the core of the village but also across the whole of the Parish and especially those of our neighbours who reside in the properties along the Worlington Road and Tuddenham Road.






