Vicar's Letter



Article for August and September – Barton Miller

On Friday 15th August I will be particularly thinking of my Uncle Wally and those like him.

My Uncle Wally only had his thumb and little finger on his left hand. His other fingers had been cut off about halfway down. When I got old enough to ask why, he showed me a copy of Eagle magazine (if memory serves) in storage which told his story and therefore told me why, without him having to go into detail. He had been serving in the Burma Campaign when he had met a Japanese officer, who got out his sword and sliced his fingers off in the fight.

This wound didn't hold him back, he continued to serve in the war, and after the war he raised a family and had jobs. He was good at making things and was a great mechanic. He even welded a seat in one of my early rather ropy cars. He didn't mention the war, it was just my childish questions about his hand that prompted his answer.

As we have been on the countdown to the 80th anniversary of VJ Day, it will come as no surprise that memories of Uncle Wally, his hand, and that comic strip have come back to mind.

His hand was a very visible and constant reminder for him, and for us who knew his story, of the horrors and service that was the reality of life for those who served in the war against Japan. But only he knew the other, personal memories of comrades lost, of horrors experienced, and of the fighting that only ended when Japan surrendered.

It's so easy for us to think that the war finished in May and so forget Uncle Wally and the others like him for who served in the campaigns against Japan.

That's why in Barton Mills on **Friday 15th August** we will be gathering at **St. Mary's Church in the morning at 9:00** and in the evening at the **Peace Garden, by the Village Hall at 18:00** to spend a short while remembering, commemorating and giving thanks for those like Uncle Wally for their willingness to fight against evil and continue fighting until it was defeated. **Do join us.**

Sadly, patience is still not one of my qualities and I am sure, like many of you reading this article, it is severely tested on a Friday afternoon when there is so much traffic and we are forced to travel via the Golf Club to try and visit Mildenhall. When things go wrong we often fall apart, we are human beings whose "patience span" is limited, sometimes even non-existent. Tempers easily fray as we wait in "queues" (often regarded as Britain's favourite pastime) at the supermarket checkouts, in traffic jams and at the railway stations and airports. One measure of our spiritual maturity is the way we act on these occasions.

The business of waiting is difficult. Christians sometimes display this trait in their attitudes toward God in His dealing with them — especially when His answers to our prayers seem odd and restricting. In Psalm 27 v 4 we are told to "Wait on the Lord, be of good courage...wait I say on the Lord." The word 'wait' in this instance, I believe, means to trust or hope. He is an all-knowing, all-powerful Heavenly Father so we can confidently expect that in His own good time He will lead us through. It's not always easy to be patient, but God can be trusted. Wait patiently for Him! In all our delays, brief or long, may we gain patience, perspective and peace as we trust in the Lord.

Good Neighbour Scheme - AUG/SEPT 2025

Many times my colleagues and I, both in the Barton Mills Good Neighbour Scheme and those across the 40+ schemes in Suffolk, have heard people from villages and towns not yet served by such schemes say that they would love to have Good Neighbour Schemes where they live.

We in the villages and towns that have embraced the initiative over the past two decades (Barton Mills over the past eight years) have recruited dedicated groups of volunteers who are keen to offer their time, enthusiasm, skills and friendship to their community neighbours. We hear all too often that our neighbours don't like to trouble anybody when it comes to tackling those little jobs that, as many of us reach our mature years, become increasingly tricky to undertake. Why not contact your Good Neighbour Scheme and see if we can help you to carry out those tasks.

It is of course possible to arrange for the supermarkets and other on-line retail organisations to deliver goods to your door but for those preferring to access local shops for at least some of their household or food provisions, perhaps we can help. Equally loneliness can be a challenge for many people of mature years if they are living on their own and find it difficult to get out and make friends. Our volunteers have, over the eight years that we have been operating, helped quite a number of villagers through the company that befriending offers. And befriending is enjoyable to both those asking for such support and to the volunteers also.

Our services, which are free of any charge, are designed to support villagers across the entire Parish of Barton Mills. This includes all residential properties along Station Road, those on either side of Worlington Road and those along Tuddenham Road. Barton Mills Ladies Club

July Meeting. Our Speaker this afternoon was Sarah Doig, who had come to talk to us about the A to Z of Curious Suffolk. Sarah was born in Mildenhall and later moved to Bury St Edmunds. Her work for the Foreign Office took her abroad for many years but she

regards herself as a Suffolk girl.

She has found stories and anecdotes about the county for every letter of the alphabet even the more obscure like Q Y X and Z She began with B for Bang. The author Daniel Defoe travelled guite a lot around the country and liked to write about his experiences. Of Woodbridge he wrote, that they made the best butter but the cheese was inedible, really awful. It was issued by the Navy to the sailors because it kept better and lasted longer than other cheeses - it was called bang or thump. In the 1750's the Admiralty stopped giving it to their sailors. Under T for Traditions, she told us about 'Dwile Flonking' The rules are a little obscure but it seems lots of ale is involved. There are two teams, who must be dressed as yokels. One of the opposing team has a dwell which is a beer soaked cloth or mop head attached to a pole. The other team forms a circle around him. He dips the dwell in the ale and tosses or flonks it at the opposing team who are dancing around him and points are scored according to which part of the body is hit. It sounds very confusing but there are some wonderful word involve -'girting', 'jobanowl', 'snurds'. The prize for the winners is a ceremonial gazunder! There were more things that she talked to us about, it was really interesting, and informative but time ran out .She brought some of

her books, one of which 'The A-Z of Curious Suffolk' several ladies

bought copies.

Our next meeting is on 12th August at 2 p.m. in the village hall, when Kevin Boardman will tell us about The Important Room - The Kitchen

NATURE NOTES

August/September

As I write this piece it is actually raining! At long last we have had some much needed rain but much more will be needed to replenish our local reservoirs which are currently at about 80% capacity. Most parts of the country have experienced drier weather than usual. Birds that probe into the soil to find insect food such as Rooks, Starlings, Thrushes and Woodcock will have struggled to obtain food. Most bird species however have benefitted from the warm weather which has provided abundant insect food during the nesting season.

We have had an amazing variety of butterflies visiting the flowering plants in our garden. We recorded the following species: Painted Lady, Red Admiral, Small Tortoiseshell, Peacock, Large White, Small White, Brimstone, Comma, Small Skipper, Meadow Brown, Common Blue and Small Copper. Many of our garden cultivars are good nectar sources, especially Verbena bonariensis, Cephalaria alpina and Knautia macedonica, the last two of which have Scabious type flowers of pale lemon and deep maroon respectively. Nectar sources are not the whole story for butterflies of course; they need native plants upon which to lay their eggs. One example is the Brimstone whose caterpillars feed only on Alder buckthorn and Buckthorn. Without their food plants they cannot reproduce.

You may still hear crickets and grasshoppers in a patch of grassland. Crickets make their distinctive chirping sound by rubbing their wings together whereas grasshoppers make theirs by rubbing their back legs against their wings. I'm no expert but to differentiate between the two species one needs to look at the antennae – grasshoppers have short, stubby ones whereas crickets have long, thin, elegantly curved antennae.

If you walk alongside the River Lark you may notice that all the male Mallard ducks have disappeared; or have they? In fact, wildfowl undergo a complete moult of their plumage after breeding. As they moult all the flight feathers at once, they are flightless for a couple of

weeks so generally stay on water during this time. The males moult into a drab, brown female-type plumage until their iridescent, bright green head feathers emerge. By winter they will be resplendent in their new plumage.

By August the Cuckoos and Nightingales will have departed for Africa, closely followed by Swifts. House martins and Swallows generally remain with us until September or even early October if conditions are favourable. Many wading birds that breed in the far north will be returning now. If you visit the coast these birds can often be seen in large groups and sometimes still in their summer breeding plumage. Two species which stand out are Black-tailed godwits and Golden plovers. Coastal nature reserves or river estuaries are the best places to find them.

Hedgehogs will still be active until the cold weather arrives; if you are fortunate enough to get them in your garden please continue to provide drinking water for them during dry spells.

As autumn approaches the leaves on some of our trees and shrubs will start to change colour. I always look forward to seeing the bright yellow, orange and even crimson leaves as they shut down for the winter. Our native trees and shrubs also provide a bounty of berries upon which many birds and mammals feed. Harvest mice become less active in winter but will build fat reserves by eating blackberries and the like. If you watched the tennis at Wimbledon you will be pleased to know that Harvest mice can be encouraged to use tennis balls with a hole cut in the side which provide a secure nesting site!


