Christmas Blessings

One of the delights of being both a mother and church minister is that I have been invited to attend many nativity plays. And I have some very happy memories – first of my own experience when chosen at the age of 6 to play the role of Mary and being heckled by my little sister in the audience whilst trying to sing my first solo.

And I still laugh at the memories of my own children taking their part – one a very grumpy angel (Laura) (two years running!) and the other a very cross and embarrassed reindeer (David in brown tights!).

Since then I have attended many school nativity plays - all of them memorable.

On one such occasion the tableau had been set with all the main characters but baby Jesus was missing! I was sitting at the front so I could see all that was going on – one minute Jesus was tucked under a chair and the next he was spinning across the floor towards the crib as a result of an over-enthusiastic shove by an observant member of staff.

It was hilarious, but the children remained like the little angels they were, with studied pious expressions.

Another time a quarrelsome Mary refused to sit next to Joseph and the pair bickered all through the performance whilst baby Jesus was passed backwards and forwards between them by his feet!

One year I interviewed a little girl who told the congregation that Jesus was coming down the chimney because he was our present! (OK, half of it was right!!).


