As I write this, we are in the second week of a national 'lockdown' for Coronavirus. We hope and pray that the future will look brighter after this period; with the development of effective vaccines and a reduction in numbers of cases and ultimately, diminishing numbers of deaths and much less pressure on our wonderful Health Service and all of the NHS staff that must be completely exhausted by events.

Of course, for local churches, this has meant another step backwards with routine worship services 'in church' having to be cancelled, just when we had seemed to find safe ways of joining together, even though it was odd being unable to sing together! (Actually, with my singing voice that is probably a blessing for all!)

That said, since March we have held a weekly online 'Zoom' service every Sunday at 11am, which has proved to be very popular. You can even sing to your hearts content in the comfort of your own home! If you would like to join us on 'Zoom' please email me as each week has unique joining instructions.

In her final service at Barton Mills on 1st November, we said a fond farewell to our Parish Priest, Revd Canon Sandie Barton as she retired to spend more time at home and in her garden when weather permits. A huge 'Thank You' to all who contributed to Sandie's gifts of a beautiful stone sundial, a wooden garden chair seat set, with cushions, parasol and winter cover. There were also beautiful flowers and even a bottle of Malt Whiskey for Lawrence! There was some money left over for Sandie to use as she sees fit. She tells me it will add to her garden, but I suspect a bottle of champagne may feature too! We pray that Sandie has a long and happy retirement.

The 1st November was also a significant date for churches in and around Mildenhall, with the joining of 17 parishes into the brand new Forest Heath Team Benefice. NORA SHIPLEY

Nora Shipley, who died on 23rd October, would have had her 90th birthday on 4th December. With her husband, David and their two daughters, Annette and Vanessa, she came to live in Barton Mills in the summer of 1976, although David was often away working abroad. She joined St Mary's Church, Barton Mills and has been a loyal and hard working member of the congregation ever since, being an active member of the Mission Group, and a church representative on the Deanery Synod for more than 40 years. She also trained with the Citizens Advice Bureau, and worked as a volunteer advisor for them for over 25 years.

Nora had many friends and, despite Covid problems, restricted numbers joined together in her funeral service, led by Revd Sandie Barton, at Barton Mills Church, on Tuesday 17th November. This was a lovely service, reflecting Nora's deep and abiding Christian faith.

I recently experienced a "disappointment", something I am sure we can all relate to. The Dictionary defines disappointment as "failure to do what is desired or expected." Christmas is perhaps the holiday when we see family members we can only catch up with once a year, however, this year many families will suffer disappointment not to be able to meet at this very special time.

Over 2000 years ago shepherds watching over their sheep in the fields around Bethlehem were told by the angels a Saviour had been born in the city of David which is Christ the Lord (Luke 2 v 11). Some wise men were given a star to follow, expecting to be able to worship the King of the Jews (Matthew 2 v 1). I am sure they would have felt a sense of disappointment if they had arrived and found nothing of any significance, BUT and what a BUT – they were not let down! All of them witnessed something extra special – the Birth of our Lord Jesus Christ. Nothing would ever be the same again. In Matthew 1 v 21 it was prophesied that He would come into the world to save His people from their sins. Ever since that first Christmas morning He has been there for each one of us and, as promised, will be our Friend and our Saviour to watch over us, to provide for us and love us. He can still be with us but not as a baby, but in Heaven. The Bible tells us He has gone to prepare a place for us and if we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness and we won't be disappointed if we have the faith to believe.

I was recently reminded of a hymn that is sung during the Christmas season:
All is well, All is well; Lift up your voice and sing, Born is now Emmanuel,
Born is our Lord and Saviour, Sing Alleluia, sing Alleluia, All is well.

To hear the words of that song at Christmastime is comforting, however, to many this year it may not be well. Those who have experienced redundancy, serious illness, loss of a loved one or depression that will not go away may cry out, "All is not well – for me!" But for those of us who celebrate the birth of our Saviour, we can experience all is well - because of Christ. We are not alone in our pain. God is beside us and promises never to leave us (Hebrews 13 v5). He promises that His grace will be sufficient in 2 Cor 12 v 9 and He promises to supply all our needs in Phil 4 v 19. Finally, He will give us an amazing gift of eternal life (John 10 v 27-28).

As we approach Christmas and enter 2021, let us not be disappointed but accept Christ into our lives, then we will be able to say with the poet John Greenleaf Whittier – "Before me, even as behind, God is, and ALL IS WELL."

CECIL FULLER, Private in the 2nd/3rd London Regiment Royal Fusiliers, died on Nov. 25th 1915 at Gallipoli, aged 23. He was the only son of Esther Fuller on whose gravestone he is remembered. This grave is a few metres from our War Grave, near the box tree with ivy on it.

Well, it's been quite a year. Covid has swept through many aspects of life and our social events have suffered most. We were delighted to be able to celebrate in February and be able to thank Rodney Knight for his many years of service as Chairman of the Trust as well as have an "official" inaugural gathering of the Preservation Trust Charity. We have our tax rebate number so we can now claim tax refunds on all donations made by tax payers, but we have not been able to hold any more social events, so no Autumn Fair and no Quiz.

We have had a couple of meetings as Trustees to complete the accounts for submission for audit and also resolve final payments from the Church PCC for the cost of the new Boiler which is installed and working well. It is now due its first service, would you believe! It really is amazing how so many supported the project. We do thank everyone who contributed for their generosity, and are grateful for Church Heritage Trust and the 100 Club for their contributions.

There are some big projects looming one of which is to sort out some of the wiring in the church so that it is fit for purpose and is up to standards required for a public building. BARTON MILLS GARDENING CLUB

We have all enjoyed spending a lot more time in our gardens this year as we have had to ensure lockdown. Unfortunately, as a group of horticultural enthusiasts Barton Mills Gardening Club have been unable to join together to enjoy the speakers, visits and general sharing of ideas. We are keeping in touch with a Newsletter and very much look forward to restarting our meetings some time in 2021. Even as the days get colder we can find jobs to do in the garden to lift our spirits and get us out of the house.

Below are a few tips from our resident guru Glenda Berrett.

Leave Christmas cacti in the same place once they have formed flower buds. If you need to move the pot (possibly to dust) mark it and put it back in exactly the same place otherwise it will drop its buds. Best thing is not to dust.!!!

To protect your hands when repotting prickly cacti, fold a couple of sheets of newspaper into a strip to wrap around the plant.

Recycle potted Chrysanths into garden plants by snipping off the dead flower heads and separating the plants (you will probably find a few individual plants all in the same pot) before planting them out 18" apart. Give them a feed to help them recover from the dwarfing chemicals they have been sprayed with and let them grow on to flower naturally in the autumn.

This would be best left until the spring as the baby plants will not cope with winter. However, this is the time of year we are persuaded to buy these lovely colourful plants and once they have finished flowering we are reluctant to throw them away. Perhaps keep them undisturbed, somewhere sheltered and barely watered, till the next year.

Spread compost or rotted manure on the surface in late autumn instead of digging it in. The worms will take it down into the soil for you over the winter.

Make leaf mould in plastic bin bags for a fast compost. Cram the bags full of leaves pushing down to form a hollow which will hold rainwater. Punch a few holes to let the water into the leaves and wait till spring. Possibly longer depending on the leaves used.

If I just want to take two or three cuttings I use a lemonade bottle. Cut the top third away, fill the bottom two thirds with cutting type compost, add the cuttings and put back the top you had cut off. It might require a further little trimming to enable it to fit inside the bottom half. The lid can be used to regulate moisture level. I didn't do drainage and found one watering at the start was sufficient to get the cuttings going.




Please will you save and donate some used postage stamps to help the RNIB (Royal National Institute of Blind People)?


