

As I write this article there are approximately 30 shopping days to Christmas, time as usual has flown. It made me think that if we woke up Christmas morning and found no presents under the tree most of us would be upset! We plan for weeks what we are going to give our parents, grandparents, children, aunts and uncles, and they too would be distressed if a gift was not produced by the 25th December.

I read several years ago about a woman who hurriedly purchased 50 Christmas cards without looking at the message inside. She quickly signed and addressed all but one, and then dropped them in a mailbox. Imagine her dismay when later she glanced inside the one unmailed card and read these words. "This card is just to say a little gift is on the way". No doubt there were 49 people wondering what happened to their presents.

God made a promise of a gift in Isaiah 7 v 14 "Behold, a virgin shall conceive and bear a Son, and shall call His Name Immanuel". Again in Isaiah 9 v 6 we read "For unto us a child is born, unto us a Son is given...." Did God keep his promise? He certainly did for we read in the New Testament, Galatians 4 v 4, "When the fullness of time had come, God sent forth His Son". As we celebrate this Christmas by giving our gifts to family and friends, let's thank God that He meant what He said – He not only promised, but He also gave, "Thanks be unto God for His unspeakable gift" (2 Corinthians 9 v 15).

As we enter the year 2023, let us put our trust in Jesus Christ for our salvation - we can be sure that God will keep His Word. In Hebrews 10 v 23 it says "He who promised is faithful". The author of the book of Hebrews encouraged believers to boldly "draw near" to God, confident that He has accepted us and our sins have been forgiven (v 22) and we are to encourage one another to be faithful to Him because we know that He will one day return for us (v 24 and 25).

Barton Mills WI Report - Nov 22

Our Speaker was Jim Stebbings who talked about 'Sentiments of Christmas'. He began with a short extract of the Christmas Show at Thursford, not too far away from us, which many of our ladies had been to at some time and some going yet again this year. Jim told us about the custom we now have of decorating a tree in our homes which Prince Albert adopted from his country of birth Germany. He said that there is evidence that Queen Charlotte married to George 111, also from Germany had a Christmas tree in her home many years before.

We joined in with one or two Carols, the inevitable 'Twelve days of Christmas' and what is believed to be Queen Victoria's favourite 'It came upon a Midnight Clear'. One very poignant part was the Christmas Truce of 1914 when British and German troops ceased hostilities and 'Silent Night' was sung. Coca-Cola began the tradition of the jolly Santa figure dressed in red to advertise their product. By far the most popular Christmas song is 'White Christmas' sung by Bing Crosby which has sold over 50 million copies since 1942.

During our Social Time we had an A to Z of Christmas things, trying to find something related to Christmas for each letter of the alphabet – some letters were easy others not so. I think we left the meeting with some festive spirit.

WI will not be meeting at the Village Hall in December, we will be having our Christmas Meal, which is for members only.




