SPEED INDICATOR DEVICE (SID)

The SID which is owned by the Parish Council is rotated between three positions in the village, Worlington Road, Church Lane and Mildenhall Road, and records the speed of vehicles travelling on these roads. The SID encourages road users to slow down creating safer roads in our Parish.

The SID is moved every two weeks by volunteers from the village. 

GARDEN BIRDS.

Anyone who provides food for the birds will no doubt have many customers either on the feeders or picking up food on the ground. Likely species include various tits (blue, great, coal, marsh, long-tailed), robins, blackbirds, chaffinches, greenfinches, nuthatches, wrens, dunnocks with jackdaws, starlings, wood pigeons and feral pigeons also taking any opportunity for an easy snack.

If you have a wide open space with a mature tree or tall posts nearby you might see a buzzard perched, ready to dive onto a smaller bird. There is at least one around the village — an immature bird as indicated by an area of white feathers on its chest. If you usually see a lot of birds but then look out and see none it may indicate that the buzzard has taken up an observation post. Such was the situation a few days ago when the buzzard swooped down to the grass and pulled up and ate an earthworm. A very light snack but better than nothing. HAVE YOU ANY BIRD BOXES? Instructions for making them can be found on line from various organisations and in books. Now is the time to have them ready to

put in position.

A Victorian Workhouse

The Lives Of The Paupers Mildenhall Suffolk

What is the book about?

My book focuses on the Mildenhall Workhouse during the Victorian era - the lives of the poor inmates rather than the building itself.

What inspired you to write this book?

When looking at old Victorian photos, it always amazed me how unchanged Mildenhall Market Place is. People that lived in the town centuries ago would instantly recognise it today. I've often wondered what life was like for those that walked the same streets we walk today and lived in the buildings we still use. In writing this book, I feel I really have travelled back in time and met former residents, people who departed long ago, but I now know them well. I want others to read my book and meet them too.

Are there any former Barton Mills residents in the book?

Yes, each chapter focuses on a different family. Chapter 7 is the life of William Sparkes, a blacksmith from Barton Mills. It's actually one of my favourite chapters, his life had a lot of twists and turns! It also touches on the subject of the Workhouse selling the bodies of the poor who died within its walls. William Sparkes' cousin - Sailsbury Sparkes wrote a poem about his friend - Martha Fletcher - who died in the Workhouse. Her body was sold for medical research before being buried in a mass grave in Cambridge. The poor really didn't own anything, not even their own bodies.

What other local family names feature in the book?

I researched many families that passed through the Workhouse, all worthy of being remembered. However, I only include them if their lives had enough interest to fill a chapter. Family names that do feature are - Jessup, Read, Graham, Morley, Trudgett, Munson, Andrews, Sparkes and Ingle.

Did you make any new discoveries about Mildenhall that you didn't previously know?

Yes, the most interesting of which I believe no-one realised and I won't reveal it here - you will have to read the book. I have discovered what I believe to be an exciting find - a small part of the demolished Workhouse is still present in the town today!

Would you write another book?

Yes. I am currently 20,000 word into a second book - A Market Place Through Time. It focuses on the buildings in Mildenhall Market Place from the time they were built (after the great Mildenhall fire of 1567) up to 2022. It details stories and events from the lives of the shopkeepers that had their businesses in the buildings over time. It's been a massive piece of work, finding these stories and collection photos and images that I believe many people would not have seen before.


