Vicar's Letter

This month's letter comes from Rev Gill Anderson, who has recently moved to join our group of parishes.

Dear friends

I'm not normally known for my love of sporting events although I do enjoy watching gymnastics and tennis when I can. However, it is hard not to catch the enthusiasm of others, especially when it comes to major events like the Football World Cup.

My family in Italy are excitable followers of their football teams and were very downcast when Italy didn't qualify for the World Cup. However they quickly switched their allegiance to England and I'm sure that fireworks will still be sent into the air whichever team is winning – such is their infectious love of celebration!

We are not all quite as good in showing emotion and celebration, yet there is something rather wholesome about looking for opportunities to do this – to celebrate with abandon, or at least share enthusiastic joy. Something perhaps we are not always very good at. With 'bad news' seeming to take priority in our media it can be easy to dismiss all the good that is going on. I think that's why I enjoy witnessing the collective hope and anticipation of team supporters with their mad hats and painted faces!

Recently I have been visited during the night hours by unknown and uninvited pests. Each morning I have been greeted by tops bitten off my runner beans and now my peas have suffered, so I took action and purchased, what my neighbour's call, George and Mildred. Barton Millers are all familiar with Scarecrows such as these, which were displayed during special weekends in the past. As their name suggests they have important jobs to do. Years ago they were frequently used to protect and preserve the crops from visiting crows. nowadays more modern methods are used.

I read this story recently during my morning quiet time. "There was once a garden where strawberries were growing in profusion. All the robins and starlings in the neighborhood received the message from the housetops advising them of the sumptuous feast available. They all gathered for a great picnic, so the owner built a scarecrow from a broomstick, an old coat, a pair of trousers, and a white hat, much the same as those pictured above. When the scarecrow was in position, the owners looked out, and much to their dismay saw a robin perched on the creature's "white hat". Not frightened at all, it seemed to sing at the top of it's voice "Free strawberries here", but other more timid, foolish birds kept a safe distance in the trees, missing out on the great feast of delicious, ripe strawberries. The wise robins were unafraid and knew that the scarecrow was only doing it's job".

The Bible tells us about lots of wise and foolish people. In Numbers 13, Moses sent out 12 spies to check out the Promised Land, a land that God said flowed with milk and honey and other blessings in abundance. Ten of them foolishly reported back that the land contained "scarecrows" in the form of giants and walled cities. However, two wiser "birds" Caleb and Joshua believed what God had promised them and came back with good news and said "Let us go up at once and take possession". Hebrews 11 tells us of many wise persons having great faith in God. They were richly blessed in all they undertook and were not hindered by any "scarecrows" of doubt and fear. Don't be like the foolish birds that hid in the trees, but be like the wise robin, not afraid to sit on the scarecrow. Let us be "Looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith; who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God (Hebrews 12 v 2).

MORE NEWS ON THE A11

Highways England will hold a public information event on **Monday** 6th **August** between 11am and 6 pm at the Jubilee Centre in Mildenhall. Come along to learn more about the planned work this autumn to relieve congestion and improve safety around Fiveways roundabout.

Highways England are also hoping to allocate funding to carry out a study of the Chalk Hill/Herringswell Road junction on the A11. This would investigate the possibilities for improving safety by minor improvements and also consider the traffic impact that a possible closure of the central reservation crossing here would have on other local roads and junctions.

It is still hoped that a long term scheme for the A11 in Barton Mills will be included in the RIS2 trunk road improvement programme but any resulting work would not be expected to take place before 2025/6. The upgrade of the A11 to expressway standards is included in the draft Department for Transport plan for the upgrade of the trunk road network by 2040. If this aspiration is to be achieved, the A11 in Barton Mills will have to be upgraded, including a through route for A11 traffic which avoids all "at grade" junctions.




