Vicar's Letter

Dear Friends.

A couple of years ago Lawrence and I were lucky enough to get the opportunity to buy a small piece of land immediately behind our garden. It was council land, formerly a farmyard but long since derelict. It was a mass of brambles, nettles and bindweed, which all seemed to be intent on invading our garden. I had had a couple of goes at gardening the edges of it over the years, clearing back the undergrowth and planting

trees and daffodils, but it was hopeless - the weeds always won.

When we finally made it our own I didn't want to tame it completely, but just to make it into a more diverse habitat to attract lots of wildlife. In 2018 five Gloucester Old Spot piglets were drafted in to clear the area without using chemicals, and what a good job they did - by summer not only was all vegetation gone, but I had 6 compost bins full of manure and a freezer full of chops (don't judge me!) Unfortunately we could now see the land was covered with tons of rubble, metal and plastic waste we hadn't realised was there. At the end of October we called in a digger to remove the waste - three big lorry-loads - and to dig a large pond.

Amazingly within 24 hours of the pond being dug, insects started arriving - whirligigs, water boatmen and pond skaters, followed some dragonflies laying eggs. Over the next few months we planted native hedge saplings, wild daffodils, snowdrops, garlic and bluebells, and

sowed the whole area with meadow grass and wild flower seed.

For a good few months it looked like nothing special - then as spring turned to summer it suddenly sprang into life, a chest-high riot of colour, buzzing with bees and hoverflies and alive with butterflies. Over the pond we already have 9 different species of dragon- and damselfly. Birds flock here to drink and feed, and bats give amazing aerial displays in the dusk. It is a breath-taking transformation which will only get better as it matures.

The bible tells us that God is like a gardener. When we allow him complete access to our lives - not just a bit at the edges but all of it - he starts to transform us. For a long time we may not look like much. But he knows what he's doing, and he is endlessly patient. Let him in, give him time, and see what a glorious transformation he can make in your life.

If you happen to wake up around 4 a.m. at this time of year, you will be privileged to hear the "Dawn Chorus". It's a time for the birds to herald the arrival of a new day. Birds of many species break the early morning silence with their songs. I am delighted to welcome into my garden robins, blackbirds, sparrows, song thrushes and the not so welcoming pigeons and crows. I thank God for the gift of hearing and the variety of sounds which fill His earth. He created hundreds of varieties of birds each with their own colors, habits and call. Genesis 1 v 21 tells us "And God created....every winged fowl after his kind: and God saw that it was good."

I have a bird feeder outside my lounge window. It's wonderful to be able to sit and watch our feathered friends as they dart about and keep an anxious watch on any intruders which may disturb their feeding. We can learn so much from their antics and a few of the lessons are as follows: It is wonderful to see the smaller birds who are able to reach the feeders and knock the seeds to the ground for the waiting pigeons and even crows who are patiently waiting to be fed below. Sometimes though, they use their size to rob the smaller birds of the seeds and fat balls placed on the bird table. Dependence on God is right and reasonable for all of God's creatures, including you and me! Like the birds we should seek God's provision daily, seek His provision expectantly for He has satisfied you before, and seek His provision actively, taking responsibility to gather it in.

The Bible is like a table, laden with nourishing food we need every day - promises, instruction, wisdom, comfort and encouragement. Like any good host, God tells us "Come and get it!" How often we fail to do this. We depend on everything but Him and wonder why our faith is so feeble. If we, like the birds, come and feast daily, expectantly and actively, our Divine Host will provide all our needs.

Depend on it! Let us thank God for the multitude of signs and sounds and colours and species that enrich our world. I praise Him for His creativity in not only forming our world but making it so beautiful—and good. In Acts 14 v 17 Paul tells his readers that God's eternal power and Godhead are clearly seen in the created world. He makes Himself known through nature. He speaks to us through His marvelous creation. His power and majesty are inescapable, we should take time from our busy schedules to listen to Him.



HIGHWAYS MEETING

Members of the Parish Council along with our District Councillor and County Councillor met with the Transport Manager from Suffolk County Council and two officials from Highways England. The Parish Council informed Highways of the issues in and around the village especially since the installation of traffic lights at Fiveways roundabout. Highways England are aware that the timings of the lights at Fiveways do require adjusting, and Highways hope this will be done by the end of August. The Parish Council are awaiting further information from Highways and Suffolk County Council in regards to a permanent solution at Fiveways. Highways England have plans to carry out safety tests on the central reservation crossings on the A11 in the near future to determine whether these should remain open. When further information is known of the future plans for the A11 and Fiveways, the Parish Council will inform residents of the village via the Barton Miller and the Parish Council website.

For our meeting this month, Barton Mills went to Beck Row for a joint meeting. Our Speaker was Pat Alker who gave us a talk on the history of tea and coffee. She began with an amusing folk tale from Ethiopia of a goat herd, Kaldi, who wondered why the red berries that his goats had been eating energised them so much. He too, felt these effects when he tried them. A passing priest heard his tale and thought that this would be a way of keeping the monks awake during prayers so he experimented by drying and boiling the berries to make a beverage.

Pat told us of her work with Project Dukem., this is a registered charity supporting the education of hiv/aids orphans and under privileged children in Ethiopia. The school she and her husband support is not far from Addis Ababa. All the children walk to school and the lunch they are given is probably their only meal of the day. They take with them pencils, rulers etc. so that they can go to school. All these children want is an education and Pat uses all the money from her talks to fund what we take for granted. This is the first time our two WI's have got together, we were made most welcome and are looking forward to Beck Row coming to us next year.

There will be no meeting of the WI in July. We are taking a guided walk around Cambridge, which is for members only.

Our next meeting at the village hall will be on Tuesday, 13th August when our Speaker Jane Paley will give us a talk on tea.
