# Vicar's Letter



Hello, my name is Mark McCaghrey and I am the new Vicar of St. Mary's, (as well as Freckenham, West Row and Worlington).

So here's a little about me...

I grew up in West Norfolk, in a house leased from the Sandringham Estate. At the age of 18 I had two plans for my life – to leave East Anglia (because life was more exciting, and the beer was better elsewhere) and to never enter a religious building in my life (because I was an atheist and had got thoroughly bored by school religion). As you can tell I have achieved both my plans very well!

I became a Christian in 1986 at university and then moved to Farnborough in Hampshire to work as a Software Engineer. It was in Farnborough that I met my wife, Fiona. I left Farnborough to train as a Vicar, and in 1997 moved to Lowestoft where I was Vicar of a parish in the most deprived part of the town for 15 years. I then moved to Mattishall in Norfolk to be Vicar of six rural villages until the move back into Suffolk to become your Vicar.

Outside of my role as Vicar, I like to spend time with Fiona and my family – I have four adult children, and two small grandchildren – enjoy walking, good meals and watching movies. Fiona is a primary school teacher in Brandon.

I am looking forward to getting to know you and serving the village as your Vicar. It is a great privilege to be a Vicar, to be involved in important events in the community, or in people's lives, such as Christenings, Marriages and Funerals. It is also a privilege to share with you the good news which I discovered for myself nearly forty years ago – that the Creator of the Universe, loves me and you personally, sent his only Son to die for us, and wants us to be with him for eternity.

### BARTON MILLS BAPTIST CHURCH



If you happen to wake up around 4 a.m. this time of the year you will be privileged to hear the "Dawn Chorus". It's a time for the birds to herald the arrival of a new day. Birds of many species break the early morning silence with their songs. I am delighted to welcome into my garden robins, blackbirds, sparrows, song thrushes and the not so welcoming pigeons and starlings. I thank God for the gift of hearing and the variety of sounds which fill His earth. He created hundreds of varieties of birds each with their own colors, habits and call. In Genesis 1 v 21 we read, "And God created.....every winged fowl after his kind: and God saw that it was good."

I have a bird feeder outside my lounge window. It's wonderful to be able to sit and watch our feathered friends as they dart about and keep an anxious watch on any intruders which may disturb their feeding. We can learn so much from their antics and a few of the lessons are as follows: it is wonderful to see the smaller birds who are able to reach the feeders and knock the seeds to the ground for the waiting pigeons and even crows who are patiently waiting to be fed below. Sometimes though, they use their size to rob the smaller birds of the seeds and fat balls placed on the bird table. Dependence on God is right and reasonable for all of God's creatures, including you and me! Like the birds we should seek God's provision daily and seek His provision expectantly.

We depend on everything, but Him, and wonder why our faith is so feeble. If we, like the birds who come and feast daily, expectantly and actively, our divine host will provide all our needs. Depend on it! Let us thank God for the multitude of signs and sounds and colours and species that enrich our world. I praise Him for His creativity in not only forming our world but making it so beautiful — and good.

This is my Father's World – the birds their carols raise;
The morning light, the lily white, declare their Maker's praise.

# Report of June 2024 Meeting

This meeting was our AGM. It marked the end of our first year.

The Committee decided to stay on for another year but asked members to come forward and help when times are busy.

Our afternoon was spent playing board games and judging by the laughter it must have been popular.

# **NATURE NOTES**

We are now halfway through the year but there is still plenty of activity taking place in the natural world. On warm, humid days you may witness flocks of flying ants leaving their nest to mate and establish new colonies elsewhere. On landing, the larger females bite their wings off and begin to search for a suitable site in which to nest. Once established she digs an underground chamber and lays her first few eggs which she rears to adulthood. These daughter workers will then find food for her. Her colony can eventually exceed 20,000 ants!

Watch out for the orange and black striped caterpillars of the Cinnabar moth which can be found feeding on Ragwort plants. Although Ragwort is toxic to most creatures this caterpillar is adapted to cope with the toxins so it becomes toxic itself, hence the warning colours. The pink and black adult moth can be seen flying during the day.

The charity Butterfly Conservation is holding the Big Butterfly Count which runs from 12<sup>th</sup> July to 4<sup>th</sup> August. It involves recording which butterfly species you see in a 15 minute period. If you wish to participate see their website for details.

Plants to see this month include Houndstongue, Meadowsweet and Viper's bugloss. Meadowsweet was formerly used for medicinal purposes as it is high in salicylic acid which is a pain reliever. This is now synthesised chemically and sold as Aspirin. The large dark brown seeds of Houndstongue are infamous as they are covered with barbed hooks which make them stick to clothing and even your cats and dogs. This is how theirs seeds are spread far and wide. The Viper's bugloss is a beautiful plant with tall,

bright blue flower spikes. It is common in the Brecks and coastal dunes where it thrives on poor soil providing a rich nectar source for bees.

If you are out at night you may find Glow-worms. Not a worm at all but a small beetle, the female of which glows in the dark to attract a mate. The glow is achieved by a chemical reaction causing them to become bioluminescent. In Suffolk, good places to see them are Blaxhall Common and Newbourne Springs SWT reserves. In Cambs., Cherry Hinton Chalk Pits is a good site. However, you may be lucky enough to see them in grassland nearer to home.

With a general election looming, it would be good to think that the poor state of our native wildlife would be high on the political agenda. Sadly, having seen their manifestos, all political parties seem to have given this situation a very low priority. With 70 of our once common birds species red-listed as being of serious conservation concern and another 70 amber-listed one wonders what it needs to get governments to take this issue seriously. There is no single cause for this catastrophic decline but a combination of factors of which I am sure we are all aware. I seriously do not know who to vote for!


