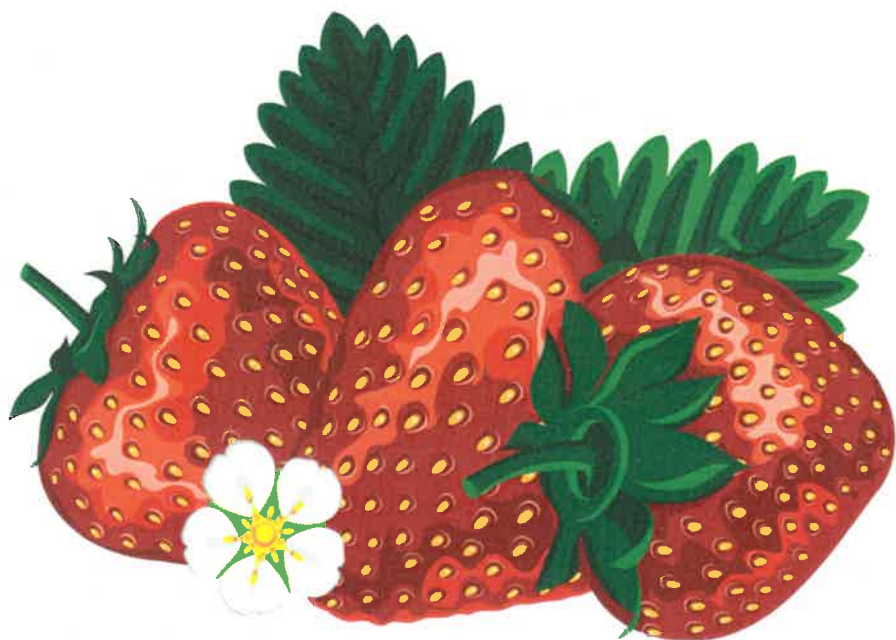

Article for June 2025 – Barton Miller

One of the unusual items of St. Mary's is the mural above the chancel arch. It is a large picture of Jesus as a shepherd with the text "There shall be one Fold and one Shepherd" next to it and "I am the good shepherd" underneath. It dates back to 1911 and was done under the instruction of Sir Giles Gilbert Scott, architect of the Anglican Cathedral in Liverpool and Battersea Power Station and part of the renowned Gilbert Scott family.

Our mural of Jesus the Good Shepherd is both a revival and a retelling of the kind of mural that would have been in its place when St. Mary's was first built. Medieval churches like ours would have been filled with colour – painted with vivid images of stories from the bible and the lives of the saints – stories to inspire and to challenge.

Above the chancel arch, above the Rood Screen that would have stood there to cut people off from the priests and the ritual of the Mass, there would have been a mural of Jesus as Judge. This references Matthew 25:31-46 which points us forward to the time when Jesus will judge us all and ask us what we have done with the precious gift of our lives. Have we used it to bless others, especially those in need, or have we used it selfishly?

But when Gilbert Scott reinstated a mural above the chancel arch, he didn't reinstate Jesus as Judge, but rather Jesus as Shepherd - who cares for his flock and through his death on the cross brings them life, referencing Jesus words in John 10:11-18.

We need to hold onto both images of Jesus. He is the Good Shepherd who has laid down his life that we might live. Without the cross and his death for us, we have no hope of life eternal. But we also need to remember that we are accountable for our lives to Jesus the Judge. Each one of us will face him and be judged by him. Are we ready for that?

Last month I introduced the new Friends' Group for St. Mary's. We have already had many people join to help preserve Gilbert Scott's mural and the other treasures of our church for future generations. It's never too late to join and I hope you will do so.

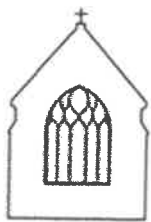

## BARTON MILLS BAPTIST CHURCH



I am sure you will agree **our village is a delightful place to live.** We should be thankful that we can enjoy great walks enabling us to think about where we live and possibly reflect on our claim to fame. **Vaccines today have saved many lives, and** the discovery of penicillin in 1929 by Sir Alexander Fleming, a Scottish physician and microbiologist, discovered penicillin **was one of the greatest feats of our time.** On a wall just beyond Bell Lane in The Street there is a plaque stating **this great man lived here in the village from 1921 – 1955.** I know I have mentioned this story before but it is certainly worth repeating over and over again, especially for our newcomers.

*A gathering of friends at an English estate nearly turned to tragedy when one of the children strayed into deep water. The gardener heard the cries for help, plunged in, and rescued the drowning child. That youngster's name was Winston Churchill. His grateful parents asked the gardener what they could do to reward him. He hesitated then said I wish my son could go to college someday and become a doctor. "We'll see to it", Churchill's parents promised.*

Years later, while Sir Winston was the Prime minister, he was stricken with pneumonia. The country's best physician was summoned, his name was **Dr Alexander Fleming**, (mentioned above), he was also the son of that gardener who had saved the young Winston from drowning. Later Churchill remarked, **"Rarely has one man owed his life twice to the same person".**

**Churchill's experience reminds us of our double indebtedness as Christians to God.** First our Heavenly Father gave us the previous gift of physical life, then through His son, the Great Physician, He imparted to us the priceless gift of eternal life." This should motivate us to present our bodies as a living sacrifice to the Lord (Romans 12 v 1) to Him we are doubly indebted for life.

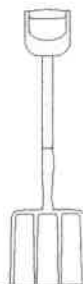
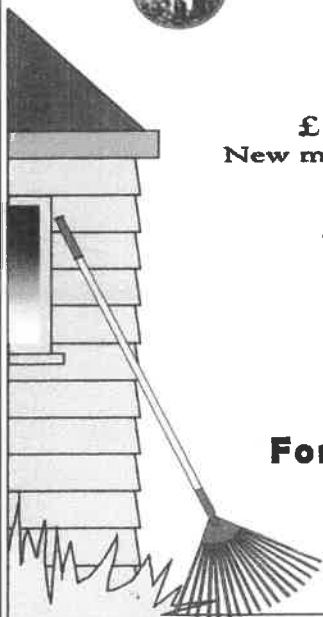

## NATURE NOTES

In April I spent a week in the British Overseas Territory of Gibraltar. This peninsula of Jurassic limestone rises to a height of 1,396 feet and has an area of just 2.6 square miles but has a surprisingly rich and varied flora and fauna. Even more surprising, about 40% of the land area is designated as a nature reserve. My purpose was to help monitor the spring bird migration across the nine mile wide Straits of Gibraltar. Migrant birds travelling from Africa into Europe are forced to make a dangerous crossing of the Mediterranean Sea. To minimise risk they choose the shortest crossing point, either at Gibraltar or further west at Tarifa, Spain. Many small birds migrate during the night so by early morning the trees and bushes can be alive with a whole host of species. Bird ringing takes place in the mornings with mist nets set in the shrub area. Once ringed, weights and various biometrics are taken before they are released to continue their journey. This long-term study records numbers of migrants passing through. We captured many different species including Bee eater, Common nightjar, Red-necked nightjar, Turtle dove, Nightingale, Redstart, Pied flycatcher, Spotted flycatcher and ten species of warbler.

The second monitoring technique is to count the birds of prey as they cross the Straits. Most large raptors cannot fly long distances by just flapping and gliding as they soon tire so they wait until the land warms up to take advantage of the thermal up-currents. They then gain sufficient height to soar over the sea. For this reason raptor migration generally takes place in the afternoon. Timing is critical; if they miscalculate their journey they may well perish by falling into the sea. Some that do are lucky enough to be rescued and get taken to the local raptor rescue centre where they are cared for until they can be released. The range of species and numbers we recorded was nothing short of amazing: we saw Griffon vultures, Egyptian vultures, Black kite, Booted eagle, Short-toed eagle, Sparrowhawk, Hobby, Peregrine falcon, Osprey, Honey buzzard, Marsh harrier, Hen harrier, Montague's harrier, Black stork and White stork. We even had a flock of 40 Flamingoes although they did seem to be a bit lost!

Two or three huge cruise ships arrive in Gibraltar port each morning. By the afternoon many of the passengers make their way by bus or

taxi to a viewpoint on the Upper Rock close to the bird observatory. From there they can see Gibraltar, Morocco and Spain. One afternoon a flock of eighteen majestic Griffon vultures flew over at no more than fifty feet above us. The tourists were so busy making memories and taking 'selfies' they failed to see the birds; no-one even looked up!

There are few trees as most of them were cut down for fuel during the Great Siege of Gibraltar between 1779 and 1783 and never replanted. However, there are plenty of shrubs and an abundance of wild flowers. There are more than 600 species of wild plants and over 600 species of butterflies and moths. The national flower is the Gibraltar candytuft, *Iberis gibraltarica*, with blooms of pale violet to almost white. This is also a popular garden plant at home. To describe all the beautiful flowering plants would take a whole book but we did see some notable species: Wild gladiolus, Snapdragon (Spanish toadflax), Sweet Alison and Mallow-leaved bindweed to name but a few. Butterflies and moths were common; we saw Striped hawk moths and Humming bird hawk moths feeding on nectar in daylight. Migrant Painted lady butterflies were also common along with a new one for me – Cleoptatra – a large butterfly like a Brimstone with large orange patches on the wing.

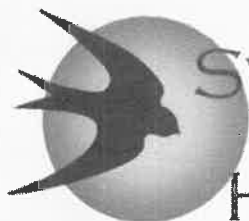

## **BUDDY SCHEME**



The Parish Council would like to encourage participation in the initiative of a Buddy Scheme for those with a known heart condition or illness. The scheme encourages parishioners to buddy up with their neighbour(s) who could assist in getting help and retrieving the defibrillator in Bell Lane.

A defibrillator is a device that delivers an electric shock to the heart to restore a normal rhythm in cases of potentially fatal abnormal heart rhythms, such as ventricular tachycardia or ventricular fibrillation. It is crucial in treating sudden cardiac arrest, as it can help the heart start beating again when it has stopped. Defibrillators can be found in various forms, including automated external defibrillators (AEDs) for public use and implantable cardioverter defibrillators (ICDs) for patients at high risk. They can be life saving devices!
