Vicar's Letter

This month's letter comes from Rev'd Gill Anderson, one of our team of ministers.

Dear Friends

I recently found an ancient pack of bulbs that had been mislaid and not planted in the autumn. So, instead of a warm bed of soil, these rather sorry-looking, forgotten bulbs, were planted last week on a bitingly cold morning in hard, frozen earth in the hope that they might yet grow and flower this spring! It was worth the effort – I figured I didn't have much to lose except 30 minutes inside in the warm!

It is this sort of optimism which 'raises its head' every time we decide that something is worth taking a chance on — despite poor odds! And many of us I am sure go that extra mile regularly to do just that. 'I'll try one more time'! 'It's worth another attempt... etc. etc.'

It is this type of attitude – hardy optimism – that flavours our lives, and when we are rewarded with a positive outcome, the joy is all the more sweet and increased in value.

There's a well-known bible story about a shepherd who had one hundred sheep. One of his sheep goes missing and even though the ninety-nine were all accounted for, the shepherd leaves them to look for the one that was missing. When he eventually finds it, he joyfully brings it home, calling everyone to share in his happiness.

This story is really telling us that every single one of us is important to God, and that when we get a bit lost, he will not give up in searching for us.

It's easy to lose our focus, to stray away from all we know to be good and true - when we are feeling low, unsure about the future, or sad about a situation. We can so often want to give up and turn our backs on optimism and hope.

Isn't it great then that God doesn't give up on us! Every second of every day he plants, and replants, seeds of love and hope into our lives, waiting for germination – this season, next season – and even when we are hard and unyielding he continues to sow in joyful anticipation that we will recognise our Creator and grow towards him.

So when you next see or plant a forgotten bulb, say a prayer for all who believe they are forgotten and outside the love the God – remembering to give thanks that God will never give up on any of us, his beloved.

How often we take things for granted. I remember back in the 1970's when the electricity companies were striking for better conditions and wages, we had to experience up to 3 - 4 hours of power cuts. When I came home from work, even though I knew the whole village was in darkness, I still attempted to switch on the lights. When we turn our taps on, we always expect to receive running water and many of us take it for granted that when we switch on the ignition of our cars in the morning, they will start up first time. Strikes now are few in number, however, as I was writing this I heard that schoolchildren were striking in protest against climate change. As this little poem suggests - Have you ever thought about what would happen "IF GOD SHOULD GO ON STRIKE"

How good it is that God above has never gone on strike, because He was not treated fair in things He didn't like;

If only once He had sat down, and said "That's it! I'm through: 'I've had enough of those on earth, so this is what I'll do -

I'll give my orders to the sun – Cut off the heat supply: And to the moon, give no more light, and run the oceans dry."

Then just to make things really tough, and put the pressure on ,"Turn off the vital oxygen till every breath is gone".

You know, He would be justified, if fairness was the game, for no-one has been more abused or met with such disdain

Than God, and yet He carries on, supplying you and me with all the favours of His grace, and everything for free!

Men say they want a better deal and so 'on strike' they go; but what a deal we've given God, to Whom all things we owe.

We take God and His marvelous attributes for granted. Because we are carried along daily by His unending stream of love, wisdom, power and mercy, we are apt to accept His goodness as just an ordinary part of life. We might even forget what a great God we have. PARISH COUNCIL ELECTIONS

Parish Council Elections are held every four years, in May 2019 elections will be taking place in the Parish. If you would like to be part of the council, which includes making decisions to improve the parish and community then please consider this opportunity.

To stand as a Councillor you must qualify to stand, you must be nominated and you must submit a Candidate Consent form. The nomination pack can be completed from 22nd March and must be hand delivered to West Suffolk House before 4pm on 3rd April 2019. There will be a poll, a contested election, if there are more than 9 candidates. The poll will take place on 2nd May 2019 and those elected will take office from 7th May 2019 for four years.

There will be no poll, an uncontested election, if there are 9 candidates or less, and candidates will take office from 7th May 2019 for four years.

Our Speaker, Jeanette Moser, has had the most amazing life and told us some of her adventures. Her mother and father fled Nazi Germany and settled in South Africa. Jeanette later settled in Rhodesia where she enrolled in the police force. She was there for seventeen years training police men and women self defence - judo. She later studied psychology to help those who had been involved in violent events. While in the police force she was shot in the leg having come upon a hijacking on her way home one night. managed to turn her car around go back to the police station to alert them about the incident. She was head hunted by Special Branch to go under cover to infiltrate a gang of arms smugglers. This proved to be very successful and the gang were arrested. Jeanette too was arrested, as she was still undercover. but much to her horror they forgot to release her and so she spent a night in iail! Her nickname at this time was 'The Mata Hari of Harare'. She gave us some hints on how to keep ourselves safe and what we could do if faced with an attack, not to go into fright mode, but to take advantage of the situation. Jeanette was happy to tell us her age - 81. She has just undergone surgery on her foot so was not able to show us these helpful moves as well as she would have liked - a formidable lady even with crutches.! It was more like a John Le Carré or Frederick Forsythe novel than this ladies' life. Our evening ended with a Valentine themed raffle.


