### Dear Readers

From time to time people ask "Why Pancake Monday?" - Shrove Tuesday being the traditional day for pancakes. Tuesdays is the village regular day for several other clubs and groups, when members of these were also church members, who would be doing the "work" behind the pancake event, so we switched to Monday and it developed into a regular feature without clashing other "movable" date decreed Shove Tuesdays. The idea for pancakes on this day came from the very old tradition of using up accumulated food (particularly eggs) before the beginning of Lent with its dietary restrictions. This also allowed a period when eggs could be hatched into the next generation at a good time for chicks, followed by hens coming back into full laying mode. Pancake Monday is one of our most popular events.

# Vicar's Letter

### Dear Friends

As I write, spring is definitely in the air, flowers are budding, birds are tweeting – and yet the country is undergoing, in many places, the worst flooding in living memory. Luckily for us, we haven't seen the worst of it in our part of the country, but our hearts go out to those further north and west who have seen their villages, farmland and homes devastated. I heard a man on the radio this morning, who when asked by the interviewer, "Are you concerned about the effects of climate change?" said, "I don't know that it has anything to do with climate change – it's just these relentless storms we keep having, I've never seen it like this before!" His comment sounded to me like a pretty good description of a climate that is changing.

As you may know, I recently travelled to Ethiopia, where people struggle daily with the fact that the weather they are experiencing is not like anything they have seen before. If you would be interested to know more about my experiences, I am going to be giving an illustrated talk at Freckenham Village Hall on Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> April at 7pm. All are welcome, there will be a bar, no charge for entry but we hope you might feel moved to make a donation to Christian Aid towards the work they are doing out there.

Another event open to all which is designed to help us to become better informed about these things is a film night, also at Freckenham Village Hall, followed by discussion. This will be on Saturday 21<sup>st</sup> March, doors open at 7pm – the film will be "An Inconvenient Sequel" Al Gore's recent follow-up to his 2007 film "An Inconvenient Truth".

While I am telling you about forthcoming events, let me also tell you about our Alpha Course – if you have ever wondered whether there is anything in the Christian faith but never really looked into it properly, this is a great way to find out more with no strings attached. It's a 12 week course in a very relaxed atmosphere, on 12 Wednesday evenings (plus one Saturday) from 22<sup>nd</sup> April. # ST MARY'S CHURCH, BARTON MILLS PRESERVATION CHARITABLE TRUST

This year sees the 24<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the foundation of the Trust as a sub-committee of the Parochial Church Council of St Mary's Church. This informal arrangement had worked well over the years, but this year, both the Trust committee and the P.C.C. have agreed that it will be better and more transparent if the Trust becomes an independent charity.

This may well make it easier for people who are not churchgoers or who are members of other faiths, but who care about the beautiful and historic church building in our village, to become members of the Trust.

Over the past 24 years, the Trust has raised many thousands of pounds, much of it from the Scarecrow Festivals, and this money has been used to keep the building in good order, so that now it is a pleasant and welcoming place for all to enjoy. And the church building can be a community centre for very many different purposes, such as concerts, meetings and other activities.

So we are moving into a new phase in the life of the Church Preservation Trust. There is an opportunity for new people to become members, and to become Trustees and help on the committee. We need to continue to raise funds for the Trust, both by regular donations and by special money raising events. Would you like to help with some of this?

The new Charitable Trust was launched at the 'Pancake Monday' meeting on 24<sup>th</sup> February, when we also thanked our recently retired Chairman, Rodney Knight, for his generous and skilful leadership since the Trust was founded in 1996.

How often we take things for granted. I remember back in the 1970's when the electricity companies were striking for better conditions and wages, we had to experience up to 3 - 4 hours of power cuts. When I came home from work, even though I knew the whole village was in darkness, I still attempted to switch on the lights. When we turn our taps on, we always expect to receive running water and many of us take it for granted that when we switch on the ignition of our cars in the morning, they will start up first time. Following is a poem I thought well worth passing on.

### "IF GOD SHOULD GO ON STRIKE"

How good it is that God above has never gone on strike, because He was not treated fair in things He didn't like; If only once He had sat down, and said "That's it! I'm through: 'I've had enough of those on earth, so this is what I'll do -

I'll give my orders to the sun - Cut off the heat supply: And to the moon, give no more light, and run the oceans dry." Then just to make things really tough, and put the pressure on,

"Turn off the vital oxygen till every breath is gone". You know, He would be justified, if fairness was the game, for no-one has been more abused or met with such disdain

Than God, and yet He carries on, supplying you and me with all the favours of His grace, and everything for free!

Men say they want a better deal and so 'on strike' they go; but what a deal we've given God, to Whom all things we owe. We don't care who we hurt or harm to gain the things WE like - BUT -

what a mess we'd all be in IF GOD SHOULD GO ON STRIKE.

We take God and His marvelous attributes for granted. Because we are carried along daily by His unending stream of love, wisdom, power and mercy, we are apt to accept His goodness as just an ordinary part of life. We might even forget what a great God we have. The apostle Paul realized how prone we are to do this, for in Romans 11 he breaks forth in praise to God, v 33 says "Oh, the depth of the riches both of the wisdom and knowledge of God!" Take time now to think upon God's greatness and thank Him for His grace, v 36 tells us "of Him, and through Him, and to Him, are all things."

In 1874, Giuseppe Verdi was Italy's most celebrated opera composer at the height of his Powers, feted throughout Europe, each new stage work eagerly awaited.




