Vicar's Letter

Lenten Reflections



Of all seasons, I find that spring is the one that stops me in my tracks!

The greening, the budding, the activity and lengthening daylight, all speak of new birth, new hope and new opportunities, and never fail to lift my spirit. Last week I was so entranced by a new bird song filtering through my windows that I had to stop, open my window, and just stand and listen. 'Spring has sprung', as they say, and birdsong gloriously announces its arrival.

One of the things the Church of England is especially good at is announcing the different seasons of the Church Year through its liturgy and worship. Just as the spring holds promise of new birth so too does the church season of Lent – a time when the church almost holds its breath as we reflect on the promise of life that God offers all of us – a restoring of relationship with him bound for eternity – all made possible through the life, death and resurrection of his Son Jesus.

By the time you receive this magazine we will be entering the season of Lent which begins on Ash Wednesday (the day after Shrove Tuesday – Pancake Day) and culminates on Easter Day with the celebration of Jesus' glorious resurrection.

For the church, this season is a time of solemn waiting and reflection. The vestment colours reflect this (purple) together with the liturgy, and flowers are often removed from our places of worship.

Yet this is also a time of immense hope - when we are aware of God's unfathomable love for us all and promise for all who believe in his Son:

'For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but have eternal life' (John 3:16)

Just as I needed to take time out to fully appreciate the birdsong in my garden, why not also take time out to join with the church in the Lenten Studies offered and, as we approach Easter, hear in church for yourself the story of Christ's Passion that has become for us the story of 'Good News'! Full details of all of the studies and services are in the magazine.

Prayer: Living God,

Teach us that the Gospel not only sounds good news:

It is good news! Amen

REGISTERING YOUR APPLIANCES

Suffolk County Council are urging residents to make their homes safer by registering their appliances.

As part of the Fire Kills Campaign, Suffolk Fire and Rescue Service, along with Suffolk Trading Standards, are encouraging people to make their homes safer by registering machines at

registermyappliance.org.uk.

Registering an appliance can be easily done regardless of whether this was already in situ at a property when you moved in, bought second-hand, or installed many years ago, as you don't need to have a receipt or know exactly when the item was first purchased.

Registering your appliance helps minimise the risk of fire posed by dangerous or faulty products which have been recalled. On the website handy tips guide the user through how to find the important model details, meaning all the user needs to supply is their name and address. This data then goes directly to the manufacturer for use exclusively in case of a recall.

To increase safety and the life of appliances the Register My Appliance portal also offers:

- · A listing of appliance safety repairs and recalls
 - · Hints and tips on household safety
 - Recommendations for appliance care

SCAMS AND FRAUD

Scams are, unfortunately, on the rise. Scams include texts, emails, or phone calls, there are scams relating to Covid supposedly from the NHS or your GP, requesting payment for the Covid-19 vaccination or the Covid-19 Pass. Although these can often appear genuine, the NHS will never ask you to pay for the vaccine or Pass, or to provide your bank account or card details. Whilst internet shopping, care should be taken when making any purchases

online. Beat the cyber crooks by only shopping at reputable retailers and doing your research first. This can be done by using independent review websites such as Trust Pilot: *uk.trustpilot.com*. Paying for items using a credit card is another great way to help you shop safely, as if there's a problem with your purchase or the company you've bought it from fails the Credit Card company has equal liability.

If you want to stop others from being scammed, sign up to become a Friend Against Scams at: www.friendsagainstscams.org.uk/. Although scams may be on the rise, if we all work together, we can stop fraudsters in their tracks and ensure that Suffolk continues to be a safe place that everyone is proud to call home.



NATURE NOTES

Floral tributes in the Churchyard.

When choosing wreaths, cut flowers or plants to be placed on graves at Eastertide, or any other time, one needs to be aware of the species that are especially liked by muntjac deer. Top favourites for the deer are primroses, primulas, tulips and roses, but others also will be eaten. It would be helpful if people shared their information on floral survivors/victims.

Blaming these small deer is unjustified. They are here by the hand of man, just one of the invasive introduced species which have been extremely successful and are now so common in England. Another that you all know about is the grey squirrel, which out-competed our native red squirrel, the last of which seen in our local forests was in the 1970s.

Reeves's muntjac, to give its full name (there are other species of muntjac, but not in UK), are native to China but were released from captivity in Bedfordshire in 1901 and subsequently from other locations. They gradually extended their range, hampered only by our rare severe winters when there has been deep, persistent snow, and are now present in almost all counties of England and some parts of Wales.

Births occur throughout the year, there is no fixed breeding season. Females can become pregnant when 10 months old, (sometimes earlier) and a single fawn is born 7 months later. Within a few days the mother is likely to be pregnant again.


