#### Vicar's Letter

One of my favourite flowers is the snowdrop.
When I see the first gentle white flowers glisten in the sunlight of a clear late winter's day it really lightens my mood and brings me joy.

For me it is a sign that winter is nearly over and spring is on its way. Sometimes the snowdrops appear when the snow is still around, or else winter refuses to give way and hard frosts or late snows trouble us for a few weeks more. But we know that the season is about to change and very soon the buds will open, the first luminous green leaves will appear, and the other bulbs and flowers will be spreading their multi coloured array around us.

But when the snowdrop first appears, all that riotous colour and growth is over the horizon. Our world seems locked in the firm grip of winter, never to escape. But to me the Snowdrop seems to be saying "Don't be fooled. Winter is nearly over. Spring is on its way."

All too often our world seems held in the icy grip of a Spiritual Winter. It can be the evil committed by one human against another, seemingly random tragedies that can engulf individuals and communities or the more personal struggles of ill health, broken relationships and the loss of those dear to us. Or the spiritual blindness of a world that does not want to acknowledge its creator, our own failures and sins, and our habitual turning from the face of God. Then Winter's reign seems hard and cold.

But we have a sign that the Spiritual Winter is coming to an end, despite its seeming eternal hold. As the stone was rolled away from the tomb and Mary, Peter and John peered in and saw the folded grave clothes placed neatly out of the way and the tomb empty of its reason for being, then the Snowdrop appeared. Death is defeated. Victory is won over the grave. Winter's rule is coming to an end. Springtime is on its way.



#### MILDENHALL BANKING HUB

A new temporary banking hub has opened in Mildenhall while the hunt for a permanent location continues. The hub, operated by Cash Access UK, will be running its services at The Pavilion, in Recreation Way, between 9am and 5pm from Monday to Friday. It will be offering a counter service operated by the Post Office, where customers of all major banks can carry out regular cash transactions.

The hub also offers a community banker service where customers can talk to their own bank about more complicated issues on the day their bank is in the hub which is as follows:

Monday: Barclays Tuesday: NatWest Wednesday: Lloyds

Thursday: Santander (pm only)

Friday: HSBC

The opening of the temporary hub follows the loss of banks Lloyds and Barclays in Mildenhall over the last few years.

This month, the Preservation Trust needs to share with the whole parish that we anticipate major change in our organisation this year. There will be a letter going out to subscribed members that will need serious consideration before the AGM, which will take place on Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> April 2025 in the church.

I will also send letters to anyone else who is interested or concerned about the changes, either by email or delivery depending on your preference, if you contact me, details at the foot of the page.

The current committee of the PCT have taken advice over the last 3 years from the Charity Commission, researched support from the National Council for Voluntary Organisations, and finally taken advice from Revd. Mark as he is now our permanent incumbent and has knowledge of other types of structures for fund-raising groups.

#### Report of the February meeting 2025

Our Speaker was John Saunders who had come to talk to us about The Bracklands. We were expecting to hear about the area of Norfolk and Suffolk with its heathland and rare wild life, but we were all mistaken as The BrAcklands and not BrEcklands, is an area of Bury St. Edmunds.

The Bracklands is an area steeped in history, divided into Long Bracklands and Short Bracklands. The name Bracklands means broken or rough land between the rivers Tay and Lark. The Tay is no longer a river but a ditch.

The area seems to have had a colourful past. There were lots of public houses and places of worship. Few remain today. One of them The King William, better known as the King Billy which was pulled down in the early seventies. Rumour has it that the Home Guard made themselves at home in one or two of them. It was more desirable to live in Long Brackland most of which is now renamed St. Johns Street. Little remains of this area of Bury as the houses were small and terraced, and have been replaced.

# Good Neighbour Scheme volunteering to help in our community

#### **NATURE NOTES**

On my walk along the River Lark, I was contemplating what to write about this month; then it struck me – why not write about the Lark itself? In World terms it is a rare habitat and one of just over 200 chalk streams worldwide, 85% of which are in England. Our river first rises through the chalk and appears as a spring at Bradfield Combust then meanders through the Suffolk and Cambridgeshire countryside for 35 miles to join the river Great Ouse just south of Littleport. Although initially a small stream, it becomes a large river once added to by its twelve tributaries.

During the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries attempts were made to make the river navigable, which was finally achieved in 1716 when boat traffic was able to reach Fornham All Saints. Barges carrying coal, iron and all sorts of building materials destined for Bury St Edmunds would no doubt have carried grain and other farm produce on their return journey. With the arrival of the railways and improved roads, the horse-drawn barges ceased to be financially viable, so the River Lark was officially abandoned as a commercial waterway in 1888. Some traffic continued until the 1920s. Now the Environment Agency has started an ambitious project to restore the river to a more natural state. A fish 'swim' is currently being built at the rear of The Mallards in Mildenhall at a cost of one million pounds. This should allow eels and fishes to travel to the upper reaches.

Speaking of eels, the European eel Anguilla anguilla is a critically endangered species which has declined by 95% since the 1980s. Recently young eels (elvers) have been released into the Lark in an attempt to increase the local population. Only time will tell if this strategy is working, as eels are migratory and actually breed in the Sargasso Sea off the east coast of North America, before swimming back across the Atlantic Ocean to reach Europe. Their average life span is 15-70 years; they reach

up to a metre in length with a weight from 0.5 to 5kg.

My research suggests we have several other fish species in the Lark including Brown trout, Carp, Chub, Dace, Perch, Pike, Roach, Rudd and Tench. Although water quality has improved in recent years, all English rivers have failed the test for chemical pollution carried out in 2019, mainly due the presence of flame retardants and other toxic substances, which still find their way into our watercourses. It is not really understood how these chemicals affect water life.

It's not all bad news though! Otters have returned in recent years so it is often possible to see them swimming and frolicking in the river as we pass on our riverside walks. Apparently they do eat the Signal crayfish, an introduced alien species, so may help to restore the natural balance of wildlife. Another stunning creature is the Kingfisher which nests along the Lark. They excavate a nest chamber in the river bank and generally rear two broods each year. We usually spot them as a flash of iridescent blue quickly flying by. One of my favourite birds associated with water is the Grey wagtail. Recognisable by its grey back and bright yellow underparts it has a very long tail which it wags continually. Between ten and twenty pairs nest along the length of the Lark but, during the nesting season, is usually to be found near a bridge or weir. Grey wagtails feed on the margins and in amongst areas where water tumbles over rocks and stones.

All in all, we are lucky to have the River Lark on our doorstep; I certainly appreciate its benefits.

Long may it continue!
