#### Vicar's Letter

#### Just as I am

There have been two items in the media in the last few days which have disturbed me. The first was hearing some things from the trial on the police officer accused, and now found guilty, of killing George Floyd in the United States. This was an incident where the police were called out by a shopkeeper because he suspected that George Floyd had paid for goods with a forged banknote, and yet the brutal use of force by the police officer for such a minor offence seems to me to be outrageous. It also begs the question, would that level of force be used if it was a white skinned man they were dealing with? Many are asking if this was an act inspired by racist undertones within the US police.

The second item I am referring to was the Panorama programme which investigated racism within the Church of England. I found this hard to watch and far too close to home. There were a number of claims by individual clergy that the colour of their skin or ethnic background was a detrimental factor when senior clergy were deciding who should be shortlisted for posts within the Church. This, for me, was truly shocking! This is the Church of God discriminating against people for being the way that God has made them, the colour He has made them and from the background he called them from to undertake this ministry in His Kingdom. And there are far too many of these instances to be ignored or to be considered a blip.

In St Matthew's Gospel we hear the words of Jesus to those first disciples, "Go and make disciples of all nations baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit". That is, ALL NATIONS meaning all peoples, not just those like you or me. Indeed, Jesus would not be considered a "white man" in today's western world! Would we, too, reject him because of his skin colour or background regardless of what he said or did or the message of God's love that he was sharing?

It is very easy for any of us to be influenced in our judgement of people by their skin colour, racial background, faith, disability, sex or sexuality. Jesus showed us through his life that God seeks to help each of his people to be the best that they can be regardless of all of these characteristics. He calls all of us to build His body here on earth, that is all those he has called. What right have we got to dismiss people from consideration if God himself has called them!

I pray that we may all seek to build up God's people whether they are like us or not, and this must without question apply to all of those who have authority and influence within God's Church, not least the Church of England.

#### **CHURCHYARD WORK TEAMS – PLEASE HELP**



May is considered to be the **fastest growing** month in the gardening calendar. The seeds and plants we diligently set a few months ago are now well and truly **growing.** The front gardens are looking beautiful and the back gardens are bulging with shoots. This reminds us, that within 4 to 6 weeks time, Sunday lunch will consist of new potatoes, carrots and other delightful vegetables we are now encouraged to eat

The Day of Pentecost, this year is 23 May. This day reminds us of when our Lord Jesus Christ promised His disciples in John 14 v 16 that, even though He would ascend into Heaven to sit at the right hand of His Father, He would send them a Comforter, the Holy Spirit, who would give them the power to grow in grace and truth. After this event we read in Acts 12 v 24, the Word of God grew. In Acts 11 v 21, we read the early Church grew in great numbers. Like the early Christians we too can receive the Holy Spirit but to enable us to grow we need "as newborn babes the sincere milk of the Word that we may grow thereby" (1 Peter 2 v 2) If we do this we will "....grow in grace and in the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ (2 Peter 3 v 18). We must not sit back and be satisfied with our spiritual attainments but with the help of the Holy Spirit keep pressing on! We can be certain that as we allow Him to control our lives, He will help us to continue to grow.

God wants us to reach even higher plateaus of service and Christlikeness. Paul recognized this need to grow and admitted he still needed to advance in holiness (Phil 3 v 12-14). We too must not sit back and be satisfied with our spiritual attainments but with the help of the Holy Spirit keep pressing on! We can be certain that as we allow Him to control our lives, He will help us to continue to grow.

# ST MARY'S (BARTON MILLS) PRESERVATION CHARITABLE TRUST

First of all, a big 'thank you' to everyone who has already made a donation to the Trust this year.

As explained in the April Barton Miller, this Trust is now established as a charity and as a separate entity to the Church. We face the big challenge of raising sufficient funds to maintain our church as a community building that can be used for various events in addition to regular church worship services. The challenge at the moment is the upgrading of the electrical wiring in the building. This work has to be done to meet safety and insurance regulations and estimates for the work are now being sought along with a Faculty from Diocese. This application is being processed by the PCC of the Church.

Because of Covid, most of our planned events have been moved to later in the year. There will be an AGM on Thursday 18th November, which we hope will be a friendly and sociable evening. We do hope that there will be a quiz in the Village Hall in the autumn. #### Barton Mills Parish Council Draft Planning Policy

This draft statement forms the Barton Mills Parish Council Planning Policy and is an informal statement of our views and operation.

It will form a view going forward once it is approved and will be reviewed annually.

The Parish Council are asking for resident's thoughts on the statement and are welcoming comments.

If you wish to comment on the statement please contact the clerk or if you require further information please contact Cllr Steve Mullender (01638 716189) or Cllr N Horne (07590 672963)

The Parish council may adjust this policy at any date in time and may object or not object to individual applications which do not necessarily adhere to this policy.

At the Annual General Meeting of the Council, the Parish Council will appoint a Councillor with a responsibility for planning who will take a more in-depth investigation in planning matters, in order to advise the Council.

The Parish Council will consider and comment on all applications within the Parish and occasionally on those outside the Parish which have an impact on the Parish. The Parish Council will attempt to make constructive comments rather than just "object or support".

Unless the Parish Council see a specific reason, they will not normally comment on 'Tree applications', in the expectation that the District

Tree Officer will make a professional judgement.

The Parish Council will take into account relevant County, District and Parish policies and will pay particular attention to the village settlement boundary when considering any comments.

The Parish Council will consider any comments by the District and County Councillor who may have specific knowledge on applications when considering any comments.

The Parish Council would expect that the District and County Councillors will support the Parish Council views, although they are under no obligation to do so.

The Parish Council acknowledge that District Council policy is heavily influenced by the current settlement boundary and that in addition individual applications will carry more scrutiny when inside the village conservation area.

- Barton Mills is formerly designated as a "secondary village" and County guidelines therefore, is against any significant development outside the settlement boundary or changes to the settlement boundary
- The Parish Council is in favour of modest and controlled development, in order to ensure that the village remains vibrant. This was reflected in the most recent Village Plan from 2002 which had around 75% in favour of small, limited or modest development. The Village Settlement boundary has been almost unchanged since the 1980's and there is very little infill now available to enable the village to expand.
- The Parish Council did not make comment on the recent settlement boundary review as no amendments were made that affected the Parish.
- The Parish Council have commented on the recent "call for sites" and are in favour of sites WS017, land west of Church Lane, WS018, land rear of 21 Mildenhall Road. The Parish Council against the inclusion of sites WS015 and WS016, land at the end of Grange Lane
- The Parish Council had indicated provisional support for the development of the Suffolk County Council field behind the existing PC exception site. This was under the strict condition that more substantial detail on the proposal should be supplied as the current proposal did not meet planning or commercial requirements.
- The Parish Council had indicated provisional support for the development of the balance of the car boot field based on the drawing supplied. This was under the strict condition that the scheme should not be a high density, sound limiting against the A11 proposal should be supplied and other factors such a reduced speed limit on the Newmarket Road included.
- The Parish Council are at an advanced stage on pursuing an exception site housing scheme (priority for villagers) scheme in the North Western corner of the car boot field. It is planned that this will provide around 15 homes for rental and shared ownership for people with local connections.
- The Parish Council are in the early stages of investigating a formal "Parish Neighbourhood Plan".


