Vicar's Letter

Generation of Hope

My wife, Jenny, and I have recently led a Christian pilgrimage to the Holy Land. Whilst visiting the various places in the areas of Jerusalem and the Galilee which relate to the life and ministry of Jesus, we also went to a school and boys' home called Jeel al Amal in Bethany, a town a few miles from Jerusalem. Bethany is within the Palestinian territory but it has been split in two by the Israeli Separation Wall. There is great need in that area and all the boys who live there, about 50 of them, are orphans without any family to look after them. There are a similar number of boys and girls who join them as day pupils at the school. We have been there many times over the years and it is wonderful to see all the happy smiling faces of the children and the dedication of the staff to give them the best care and education they can with very limited resources. For these children there was no hope until they were taken into this school.

The name Jeel al Amal translated into English means Generation of Hope. It was founded in 1972 by Basil and Alice Sahhar as an institution for the protection and welfare of needy boys and it is now led by their daughter supported by a very dedicated team of teachers and house mothers along with admin staff. What I find inspirational about this place is that it brings hope to those who had no hope and through their care and education most will go on to get good jobs in the future and a good number of past students have gone on to study at university and come back to serve their communities as teachers and doctors.

There are many in our own country who are without hope, too. I pray that we may all be looking out for those who are lost and help them find hope!

However, we have been called upon in rare and exceptional circumstances to help some others within adjacent parishes and in such cases volunteers have elected to assist outside of the scope of the scheme. Such is the willingness to lend a hand when one is needed.

MAY NATURE NOTES.



Look and listen for swifts arriving after their amazing flight from southern Africa. They will be in desperate need to find a nesting site on a house or perhaps in our church tower and need to catch vast numbers of high-flying insects. To see examples of routes taken by these amazing

birds on their annual migrations, go to Worlington church where there is a large map on which was plotted, by the late Judith Wakelam, the migration routes taken by a swift which was fitted with a geolocator in Waterbeach, Cambs. on 28th July2011. Via southern Spain (3-9 August), West Africa (12th August) Democratic Republic of Congo (24 August-10 Dec.) it reached Mozambique by Dec. 13 and stayed until Feb. 28th 2012. Then the return journey began – via Northern Angola, Gabon, Ivory Coast, across the Gulf of Guinea and right back to its breeding site in Landbeach on May 12th 2012.

If a swift chick falls from its nesting hole and can't be put back for its parents to feed it, special skills and patience are needed to rear it. Clare Scarff at Feltwell was trained for this by Judith; 07773 226963. She is on Facebook as Wildlife Lounge.

SCARECROWS in BARTON MILLS

Some history: in 1998, Lis and Colin Brotherton, who had been visiting a village in Yorkshire which had been holding strange but successful events called 'SCARECROW FESTIVALS', suggested that Barton Mills should have a Scarecrow Festival. The idea was that lots of people should put scarecrows out in their front gardens, and other people would come to look at them. It seemed rather a crazy idea to most people but it was agreed that the Barton Mills Church Preservation Trust would organise this for Barton Mills. A programme of events was organised for a weekend in June, and lots of local people and groups were persuaded to take part. Sure enough, scarecrows of all types, not just Worzel Gummidge 'look-alikes', appeared in gardens all round Barton Mills. And people came out of their houses to look at them — and to talk to their neighbours, and to welcome visitors who also came to see what was going on. Money was raised by serving refreshments, providing car parking, entertainments and more, and was donated to various charities.

At village meetings it was decided to hold another Scarecrow Festival in 1999, and to go for a Guinness record for the greatest number of scarecrows in one place. This we did, and although we were told at the last minute that only human shaped scarecrows could be counted, so that the 101 Dalmatians at The Manor, nor the various other straw animals could be included, two local magistrates counted 761 'human' shaped scarecrows in Barton Mills on Sunday afternoon 13th June 1999. And we were awarded the appropriate Guinness Record!

Because the Festivals were proving to be such fun, and a great way to raise funds for charities, as well giving enjoyment to lots of people, it was agreed to hold another Scarecrow Festival in 2000, which we did. The programme for the weekend included dancing and gymnastic displays, a dog show, open gardens, cream teas, a music concert and an open air 'songs of praise' on the field. Once again, many charities benefited from the money raised.

Then it was decided that because the Festivals did take rather a lot of hard work to organise, they should only be held on alternate years. So 2002, 2004, and so on till 2014, were Scarecrow Festival years in Barton Mils, with themes that included Celebrities, Recycling, the Olympics, Scarycrows, and much more. Programmes included all the previous events, and even some pedal car racing! Many thousands of people from far and wide came to Barton

Mills and we achieved national recognition! And an amazing amount of money was raised for many charities, and for the Church Preservation Trust. All this was made possible by the help of many local organisations and individual people who gave so much of their time and energy.

In 2016, the usual Scarecrow dates coincided with the celebrations for Queen Elizabeth's 90th birthday, and it was agreed that the special village party being organised by the Parish Council should be held instead. In the following years, with some committee members slowing down in their increasing years, the energy needed to run Scarecrow Festivals has not been

found. But now? To celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, we hope to see some Barton Mills Scarecrows out again

HOW TO MAKE A SCARECROW!!

Scarecrows can be all shapes and sizes. Although they are usually rather like Worzel Gummidge, whose many friends and relations stand in farmers' fields, they can be made to look like animals or other creatures.

For a human shape, it is easiest to have two wooden poles, like broom handles, which can be tied together to form a cross. The upright pole should be fixed into the ground, and the crosswise pole can be tied near the top to make the arms. But, if you are putting a shirt or jacket on to your scarecrow you must slide the arm pole in to the sleeves before you tie it to the upright. Wooden arms don't bend! The head can be made by stuffing a carrier bag, then painting a face on to it, and the body can be a stuffed bin bag. Again, put the body on to the upright pole before you fix the arm pole in place. Scrunched up newspaper, or straw, are useful for stuffing. Old tights make useful legs.

There will be a **SCARECROW MAKING SESSION** in the CHURCH ROOM on **WEDNESDAY**, **18**th **MAY**, **6.30** to **8pm**. Do come to this to get some hints, and perhaps find out what other people are doing. There should be straw available in the church car park from the middle of

May onwards.

Whether or not you are one of the people who have agreed to make a scarecrow to represent one of the 70 years of the Queen's reign, please do make a scarecrow and put it out in your front garden on Thursday 2nd June, ready for the weekend, to join in the celebrations.






