I am very fortunate to have worked at the nearby airbase for 63 years and during that time I have seen many changes in the way we operate. Technology has reached an all time high and we wonder what they can do next to upgrade the system. However, there have been times during those years when the communications systems have not worked and the service provider has been called to investigate.

Our lives today seem to be **controlled by hi-tech equipment**, however, when we need to contact a utility company or purchase some insurance, we need **plenty of time to sit down and push buttons.** I read the following article recently confirming this statement: Someone needed to make a phone call to an insurance company. First came the busy signals – for an entire day! Next came a recorded message followed by music, occasionally interrupted by a voice that said, "Our lines are still busy. Please hold, or hang up and try again." Finally they got through but this led to a complicated set of instructions: For policy information, press 1. For new coverage, press 2. To make a claim, press 3. To talk to an agent, press 4 - they chose the last option. A recording said he was out of the office and told him to press the pound (#) key. The same voice repeated the same options. They finally hung up. Sound familiar?

Thank God there is no such thing as a prayer runaround. He's not "on demand" to do as we ask, but He is always "on call" to hear our prayers and provide an answer. On 28 May, Whit Sunday, we shall be reminded again of the availability of the Holy Spirit who is "standing in" for our Saviour who ascended into Heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God and is interceding for us. He has promised never to leave us nor forsake us. As Christians we believe that wherever we are God hears us when we pray, not because we deserve it but because Christ has opened the way for us to talk directly to the Father. Psalm 145 v18 says "The Lord is near to all who call upon Him, to all who call upon Him in truth". With that assurance we can come confidently to God in prayer, knowing we will never be turned away.

### Nature Notes.....

Spring has arrived! The Bramblings, Redpolls and Siskins that graced our garden feeders over the winter have headed North. The Fieldfares and Redwings that fed briefly on Cotoneaster lacteus berries in our garden during a snowstorm have returned to their breeding grounds in Scandinavia. Now Chiffchaffs, Blackcaps, Swallows, Sand martins and Cuckoos are here, to be closely followed by House martins, Swifts and Nightingales. They bring a promise of good things to come as Summer unfolds. They also bring their songs, many and varied, to delight our ears.

How many birdsongs would you identify? Blackbird? Certainly. Robin most probably. Cuckoo undoubtedly. The Chiffchaff's onomatopoeic, repetitive 'chiffchaffing'. The Yellowhammer's "A little bit of bread and no Cheeses". Then the warblers are a whole new ball game. Songs so diverse it takes years to learn them all. Bird song is all around us — if we know them we can identify a species without ever seeing it. One of my favourites is the Nightingale. Bird of legend, bird of poetry, possibly the one most written about. The best sites locally are Lackford Lakes and Maids Cross Hill, Lakenheath but hurry — the Nightingale is one of our fastest declining birds. Enjoy it while you can!

What is the purpose of bird song? Male birds need to establish a breeding territory and find a mate (in that order). He will then defend that territory against potential rivals by flying round his patch and singing at various points. I do sometimes wonder whether birds also sing purely because they enjoy it. We certainly do! Some species hold a large territory; the 150 square miles of the Golden eagle; the 3 to 4 acres of the Marsh tit; a few square kilometres for the Raven, now breeding once again in West Suffolk.

One of the smallest territories of any bird species is that of the Reed warbler. It defends a patch of only a few square yards around its nest probably because its reed bed habitat is scarce and there is a lot of competition for space. Its song is quiet and a bit uninspiring but no doubt effective. This tiny bird, weighing just 12 grams, flies to and from sub-Saharan Africa each year. The oldest recorded was almost 13 years old. How many thousands of miles did this bird travel during its lifetime? Nature never ceases to amaze!

## Will you be watching King Charles' Coronation? Perhaps you might like to try the Coronation Quiche Recipe?

**Ingredients: Pastry** 

125g plain flour Pinch of salt

25g cold butter, diced

25g lard

2 tablespoons milk

Or 1 x 250g block of ready-made shortcrust pastry **Ingredients: Filling** 

125ml milk

175ml double cream

2 medium eggs

1 tablespoon chopped fresh tarragon,

Salt and pepper

100g grated cheddar cheese,

180g cooked spinach, lightly chopped

60g cooked broad beans or soya beans

Method

1. Begin by making the pastry. Sieve the flour and salt into a bowl; add the fats and rub the mixture together using your finger tips until you get a sandy, breadcrumb like texture.

2. Add the milk a little at a time and bring the ingredients together

into a dough. Cover and allow to rest in the fridge for 30-45 minutes.

3. Lightly flour the work surface and roll out the pastry to a circle a little larger than the top of the tin and approximately 5mm thick.

4. Line the tin with the pastry, taking care not to have any holes or the mixture could leak. Cover and rest for a further 30 minutes in the fridge.

5. Preheat the oven to 190°C.

6. Line the pastry case with greaseproof paper, add baking beans and bake blind for 15 minutes, before removing the greaseproof paper and baking beans.

7. Reduce the oven temperature to 160°C.

8. Beat together the milk, cream, eggs, herbs and seasoning. 9. Scatter 1/2 of the grated cheese in the blind-baked base, top

with the chopped spinach and beans and herbs, then pour over the liquid mixture.

10. If required gently give the mixture a delicate stir to ensure the filling is evenly dispersed but be careful not to damage the pastry

11. Sprinkle over the remaining cheese. Place into the oven and +bake for 20-25 minutes until set and lightly golden.
