

# Reflections from Rev Gill Anderson

Turning out some old boxes recently I came upon some photos I had completely forgotten about. I hadn't even remembered taking them and I spent an interesting hour trying to work out where we had been and what the occasion was. With the exception of a few, most were not worth keeping, but when I had sent them off for developing all those years ago I had, of course, hoped that they would all turn out perfect!

How times have changed! Recently I ordered a book of prints taken from photos I had captured on my phone. The total cost was almost the same amount as that spent on those I had taken over 30 years ago – and all this done from the comfort of my lounge. I was able to edit, replace, recolour, and then change again and again until I was satisfied I had the perfect selection for my needs.

# REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY 11th NOVEMBER

Everyone is invited to come at 10.45am when we will gather for the Village Annual Community Service of Remembrance at the Peace Garden outside the Village Hall. This is a non- denominational service at which the names of our war dead will be read out, poppy wreaths will be laid by members of the village, and there will be a two minute silence at 11am.

The Parish Council invites everyone to come in to the Village Hall after the service to enjoy a warm up and some refreshments,

This will be the first time that we have met by the newly recreated Peace Garden – a fitting reminder that this will be the 100th anniversary of the Armistice that was declared on 11th November 1918 at the end of the first World War.





### BARTON MILLS BAPTIST CHURCH



During the month of November we set aside the 11th day to remember to thank God for our freedom and to think of all those countless men and women who gave their lives in order that we, in this country, and many other western civilizations, can live freely. Free to speak out on any subject, and to worship as we please without fear of arrest or retribution. Sadly today we are still hearing of young men and women fighting for freedom and still losing their lives, enabling us to enjoy a free and civilized existence. This year we remember especially WWI which ended 100 years ago on 11 November 1918. More than nine million fighting men were killed during the conflict, one third of them through disease. Our lives still revolve around events that have happened in times past. As there were few families that did not have one or more of their loved ones killed during the World Wars, and other altercations that have occurred since, nearly every village and town in Britain on or near 11 November have memorials either in wood and stone set up to remind us of the sacrifices they made and how it affects us today!

The word "REMEMBER" occurs frequently in the Bible. The most meaningful instance is when we are asked to think about our Precious Lord as we participate in the communion service. 1 Corinthians 11 v 24 says ".....this do in remembrance of Me." Remember the One whose selfless sacrifice resulted in benefits for people of all nations. Jesus Christ, the sinless One, died on a cross and shed His blood to pay the penalty for our sins, in so doing, He guaranteed our freedom – freedom from the penalty, power, and someday even the presence of sin. Recounting the brave service of the RAF defending Britain during WWII, Sir Winston Churchill declared, "Never in the history of mankind have so many owed so much to so few." Of Jesus it can be said: Never in the history of mankind have so many owed so much to one Man. Yes, His was the Greatest Sacrifice. Lord, help us to remember!

# **Katherine Gantlett**

Dr Katherine Gantlett will be coming to visit Barton Mills on the weekend 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> November. She will be leading a seminar in the church on Saturday 17<sup>th</sup> November on the theme 'Walking Well Through Life's Winters'. There will be three sessions, starting at 10am, with a break for lunch, and closing at 2.30pm after a question and answer time.

The truth of life is that at some point all of us go through tough experiences, no-one escapes the pains of life. In Katherine and her husband Jon's case that was the loss of 4 babies through miscarriage and the death in labour of their first daughter Libby at full term in 2012. For others it might be the loss of a loved one, the loss of a job, a home, a terminal diagnosis, or financial issues.

Over the course of the day we will be exploring the Christian response to these 'winter seasons' in life. What does it feel like, what are the questions that these times in life raise for us and crucially how as individuals and as the Church do we walk well through winter and offer support for those in this place. Katherine will share her personal experience of walking this path and offer some practical advice borne out of experience to those who currently find themselves in this season of life or are supporting others who are.

Katherine will be the speaker at the 9.30am morning service on Sunday  $18^{th}$  November.

# **BARTON MILLS PARISH COUNCIL**

### PARISH COUNCILLOR VACANCY

There is a vacancy on Barton Mills Parish Council which it is proposed to fill by cooption at the meeting of the Council to be held on 4<sup>th</sup> December 2018 at 7:30pm in the Village Hall.

Should more than one application be received for the vacancy, councillors will decide the appointment by a vote, or series of votes, in order to obtain a majority decision.

To be considered for co-option, applicants must be at least 18 years of age and a Commonwealth or EU citizen, and must meet one of the following criteria:

Be registered as a Local Government Elector for the Parish on the current Electoral Register.

Has during the whole of the previous 12 months occupied as tenant or owner any land or other premises in the Parish.

Has had his/her principal or only place of work in the previous 12 months in the Parish. Has resided either in the Parish or within 3 miles thereof during the previous 12 months.

Anyone wishing to be considered for co-option should contact the Clerk to the Council, in writing by 15<sup>th</sup> November 2018, confirming that they meet the eligibility criteria and stating why they wish to join the Parish Council.

#### THE VILLAGE GREEN

The Village Green is owned by Barton Mills Parish Council and no organised events should take place on the field without prior consent from the Parish Council. If you do require the use of the Village field please contact the clerk.

The works on the A11 have been progressing well over the last few weeks. Ducting for traffic signal cabling and traffic counting loops has been installed and also bases for new signage. ### THE LARK AND LEE GROUP OF PARISHES

From reading the Barton Miller you will be aware that our Parish is now one of a group of four churches—Barton Mills, Worlington, Freckenham and West Row—and our vicar is the Rev. Canon Sandie Barton. In this and the past two issues you will have noticed that the "Vicars Letter" has not been written by Sandie and you may have found this confusing. Sandie is, of course, entitled to a holiday, but the substitute may have alerted you to other members of Group Leadership and these few words may help clarify things.

You will, I'm sure, agree that the administration and taking of a multiplicity of services, meetings, events and welfare for the four parishes is no easy task. As a "Canon", Sandie also has other calls on her time—she can, for example, be asked, when appropriate, to preach in the Cathedral, and she also has the job of overseeing "Nature Conservation" for the Diocese, (like our Swift Box Project and other things affecting the environment) so suitable help is greatly appreciated.

Rev. David Butcher, who wrote one of the earlier letters is now a Curate, having, after a period as Lay Reader and a three year training period, been ordained Deacon in June 2018. After completing a year's probationary period, he will be fully ordained into the priesthood. We are most fortunate in having a member of one of our churches (West Row) go forward into this role: it is quite a privilege to have a curate these days.

When priests retire, they may volunteer to undertake a helpful part in the church where they are living; the Bishop sanctions this of course. We have two such retired priests in our group—Rev. Gordon Anderson, who many may remember from when we had a "Mildenhall Team", to which we then belonged. When this team was disbanded, he moved away, but after he retired, he and his wife moved back and he is now a familiar member of our Group Leadership. The Rev. Gill Anderson (no relation) joined us in 2017, when she came to live in Worlington, after leaving the Chelmsford Diocese. Gill is now retired from being a Priest in Charge of four parishes, so is able to bring a wealth of experience to our group too.

The office of "Lay Reader" (not ordained) is of long standing origin, where those taking on the role are trained to lead others and help in some services etc.. We have two of these in our Group—Mrs Caroline Butcher, wife of David Butcher and David Ball, who for many years has been a familiar, and helpful presence in our Group and other churches.

All these additional helpers are part of the leadership of our Group and we are likely to see them leading us in any of the churches in our Group. Their help is greatly appreciated.

At Barton Mills, we also have help which is local to us. We have three "Elders". DAVE TRAHER, who is also one of our Church Wardens. Dave has

long experience of ministry and Mission in Africa. As well as taking a service when required, Dave takes our Messy Church on the 2nd Sunday of the month. GLYNN EAST, who is also a Hospital Chaplain , likewise sometimes leads a service and also the 5pm Healing Service (second Sunday) once a month. COLIN BROTHERTON, (a familiar figure to many) organises the Prayer Chain for special requests and is involved with the music and other things. Many "Lay" members of our congregation also undertake various duties all of which, we hope, helps promote a strong fellowship to back our leadership.

# Local war grave and memorials.

Some churchyards in which there is a war grave have a notice to this effect, but not so in Barton Mills, although we do have one such WW1 headstone. The life commemorated is that of Private T.H.Owers of the Suffolk Regiment who died 30<sup>th</sup> October 1918, aged 18.

The head stone of the grave of Esther Fuller (d.1936) is also in memory of her son Cecil of the London Regiment of Royal Fusiliers who died at Gallipoli on Nov. 27 1915, aged 23 years.

On display in Mildenhall Museum until December is a display board prepared by Cllr. Richard Alecock. For each man listed on the Mildenhall War Memorial there is a photo or other appropriate information.

If your roots are in Brandon you may like to see the 16 page publication by Darren Norton, published by the Brandon Heritage Centre, to commemorate the armistice centenary. A reference copy can be seen in Mildenhall Museum.

To mark the centenary of the end of WW1 Historic England has given Grade 2 Listed Status to several war memorials. One of these is the 127 foot high column of Weldon and Portland stone, usually referred to as the Elveden Memorial, which commemorates the fallen from the three parishes of Elveden, Eriswell and Icklingham.


