Vicar's Letter

Dear friends

Last month you may remember, I was about to set off on an adventure, journeying to Ethiopia to see at first hand the effects of climate change and how folk there are working to become more resilient. It certainly has been a challenging and emotional trip.

Travelling over 1500km on rutted or non-existent roads, we met many proud men and women who talked of change in the seasons: of no rain in the wet times, of searing heat and new pests they don't know how to deal with.

One of the women I met, and talked with through an interpreter, was Fatuma. She was a slight, elegant young woman of 25, a member of a women's self-help group Christian Aid had helped to set up, with the aim of giving women more scope to change their own lives. She had spoken well when we asked the group about their work, telling how they were working together to produce a more efficient clay cook stove, which benefited them by reducing the amount of wood they were using, so there was less pressure on local woodland, less time spent gathering fuel and also less polluted air for the women and their children since the stoves were used outside the hut.

I wanted to talk to Fatuma one-to-one and thought it might help to show her pictures of my family. Idiotically I said that since I was a mother we would share some of the same concerns. How I wished I could take that back! Tears sprang to her eyes and she explained that she had been widowed suddenly in an epidemic and had no children. She had no family in the village, and no-one to help her farm her land. Custom dictated that only men could plough, but if a man were to plough her land, it would give them other rights that she was not willing to give. Literally all she had was the women's self-help group, which enabled her to earn a tiny income by selling the cook-stoves at the market – the difference between life and death. Any cosy illusion I had that our lives were somehow similar vanished.

Of all those we met Fatuma is the one I will always remember. Her raw pain, and the knife-edge on which she was living went right through me. Why is she there, and I am here with my comfortable life? Sheer chance. May we all recognise our good fortune and have open and generous hearts towards those who suffer far away.

Sir Winston Churchill was honouring members of the RAF who had defended Britain during WWII. Recounting their brave service he declared, "Never in the history of mankind have so many owed so much to so few." Of Jesus it can be said: Never in the history of mankind have so many owed so much to one Man. Yes His was the Greatest Sacrifice. Lord, help us to remember.

As the Prophet Mica writes in the Old Testament about God's ultimate reign of Peace; "They will hammer their swords into ploughs and their spears into pruning forks."

So we reach out beyond our finite horizons to connect with our God whose everlasting Kingdom of justice and peace will come. We, whose days are like the momentary splendour of a flower, are invited to know the God who is the eternal home of all those who trust Him.

So as we remember the fallen and with them our own mortality, we remember that in Christ Jesus, the self-giving God remembers us all as his children.



LOVE THE LARK VOLUNTEERS BARTON MILLS WORK DAY

On Sunday 22nd September members of the River Lark Catchment Partnership (RLCP) spent a warm sunny morning working in the River Lark on the footpath from Barton Mills to Mildenhall.

The river bank in this area had been subject to years of erosion, much of this caused by the Signal Crayfish. RLCP volunteers worked to install a retaining structure for the bank made of natural materials.

The pictures below show volunteers driving in wooden stakes to provide the main support. Hazel wood bundles are placed between

the stakes providing a barrier to the bank erosion. Hazel wood provides a safe area for small fish to rest and encourages other wildlife. Coir rolls are placed on top of some of the structures. These are pre-planted 'grow bags' made of natural materials and contain native river bank plants. Eventually the plants should grow along the river bank on the retaining structures

providing a natural habitat.




