An extract from The Bury and Norwich Post and Suffolk Herald

September 28th, 1875

BARTON MILLS.

On Thursday, the 23rd inst., the church in this parish was very prettily decorated for the Harvest Thanksgiving service, which took place at 7 p.m. In spite of the very unfavourable weather, the church was completely filled with the inhabitants of the village, young and old, rich and poor, all heartily uniting in the full choral service. Last year the excellence of the singing deserved warm commendation, but this season the improvement of the choir was very perceptible. For this, and for the levely floral wreaths, which made the quiet village church a fitting representative of God's "holy and beautiful house," the people are indebted entirely to those kind ladies who have for years past been forward in promoting every good work for the service of the Church and the good of their neighbours. The service was intoned by the Rev. Walter Jones, Curate of Mildenhall. The First Lesson was read by the Rev. W. Buckland Lott. Rector of the parish and Rural Dean, the Second by the Rev. Canon Abraham, Rector of Risby and Rural Dean. The sermon was preached by the Ven. F. Chapman, Archdescen of Sudbury, on Psalm xxxvii. 3. "Trust in the Lord, and do good, dwell in the land, and verily thou shalt be fed." The offertory, amounting to 4l. 10s. 11d., was devoted to the funds of the Mildenhall Cottage Hospital. The members of the choir were provided, the girls with tea, and the men and boys with supper, by the Rector, and thus pleasantly concluded their day of thanksgiving.

REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY 8TH NOVEMBER 2020 – LEST WE FORGET

This year marks 25 years since we began our annual Village Act of Remembrance at our Peace Garden on the Village Green. In 1995 we were of course commemorating 50 years since the ending of the Second World War. This year, 2020, is now 75 years since the war end. Sadly, as a consequence of the Coronavirus pandemic and the restrictions on holding public events, we are not able to hold the Act of Remembrance in the usual way. It has therefore been decided that the Act of Remembrance will proceed but with a strictly limited number of people in attendance, as determined and managed by the Barton Mills Parish Council. We will be remembering the men from Barton Mills who made the ultimate sacrifice in two world wars. Their names are:-

You may not be attending in person; nevertheless, please join us in your homes for the two minute silence at 11 o'clock (perhaps as suggested in the Press by us standing on our doorsteps) and also by reading the following prayer of remembrance.

God of truth and justice,
we hold before you those people, particularly those from our Village,
who have been injured or who have died in active service.
As we honour their courage and cherish their memory,
may we put our faith in your future;
for you are the source of life, peace and hope,
now and forever.

We are told to press on as normal but it's not normal, or is it? We are going through an unprecedented period of our lives, a pandemic never experienced by any of us before. However, we must cast aside our thoughts for a while of being unjustly treated by a virus that has been a tragedy for many and try to "Remember, Remember" the 5th, 11th and the 26th November". I am sure we all have different memories of these dates; the children for the 5th when we celebrate with fireworks, the 11th for all those men and women who sacrificed their lives for our freedom in world wars and subsequent conflicts, and finally the 26th, with our American friends, to give thanks for everything the Lord has provided us.

When things are going well we can easily become preoccupied with what we own, we become tied to so many nonessential, unimportant things. We tend to grow overly concerned about cars, houses, furniture, appliances, clothes and countless trappings of modern life, but when life is reduced to the essentials, as it is with the Corona virus, we recall again that life itself is enough reason to remember to thank God and praise Him for all His goodness to us. The apostle Paul wrote about thanksgiving more often than any other New Testament author, 23 times. As we pause to thank God for every way He has blessed us, it's good to remember that our greatest treasure is His unfailing love. Too often our thankfulness ebbs and flows with our health or financial security. We equate God's blessing with freedom from pain and sorrow, but through faith and experience we learn that God's great love for us expressed in Jesus Christ can calm our hearts and minds even in the most taxing situations.

Four times in Psalm 107 we read, "Oh that men would give thanks to the Lord for His goodness, and for His wonderful works to the children of men." Even when life seems overwhelming, we can cry out to the Lord and find His deliverance from our distress. It is not health or wealth, but God's unfailing love that sets us free in every circumstance of life. During this difficult time with the pandemic it's easy to forget but let's not lose sight of God's goodness, the source of all our blessings.

Thank you to those who contacted the Parish Council giving their thoughts and opinions on whether or not the Parish Council should help contribute towards the cost of replacing the unsafe bridge that goes over the river between Mildenhall Cricket Club and the footpath between the river and Ship Gardens.

Following the responses received Barton Mills Parish Council have agreed to support the replacement of the bridge.

Suffolk County Council are still finalising details on the bridge design, costs and schedule of works, but they hope to carry out the work before April 2021.



We were also pleased with various permanent decorations recently effected, among which we must mention the new altar-cloth, and very elegant new railing, all in excellent accord and taste, recently presented by the Rector, the Rev. William Buckland Lott. space within the railing has also been laid with very beautiful encaustic tiles by the same donor.
