Vicar's Letter

Remember, remember the fifth of November. So goes the old rhyme about Guy Fawkes and his plan to blow up the Houses of Parliament in 1605. November also brings another date of remembrance. One much more recent and which has touched the lives of so many people still alive today - the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month. This year, as in years gone by, people will gather to lay wreaths at the cenotaph and perhaps take part in services of remembrance up and down the country, which this year falls on Sunday 13th November.

Hollywood often leaves us with a sanitised, gung-ho version of those events but the reality was somewhat different. In 2000 I visited Singapore as part of my Sabbatical and, at the request of Phylis Witter, I brought back photographs of her brother's grave in Kranji war cemetery. When she saw the photographs, the years rolled back as she remembered the brother she had known as a child and who left home 80 years ago to go to war, never to return.

The root problem behind all wars and conflict is human greed and selfishness and the greater our understanding of this, the more we will appreciate what God has done for us in Jesus. This is the Good News that Christianity brings. The message that God loves us and did not leave us in the mess we make of our own lives. Jesus came as our substitute. He endured crucifixion, the most hideous and cruel of deaths in order to deal with this problem and it is indeed the most horrific of deaths.

Awful though this all was, it was not the worst pain for Jesus. The worst pain was experiencing for the first time in his life the consequences of sin as he began to experience the spiritual agony of being cut off from his Father. He cried out to his Father, "My God my God why did you abandon me" Paul describes what God has done for us in Jesus in these words: "God took the sinless Christ and poured into him our sins. Then in exchange, he poured God's goodness into us!" (2 Corinthians 5:21)

It is right that we remember the men and women who died in the two world wars and other conflicts of the 20th century. They paid an awful price for our freedom. But as we do so let us also remember a God who loves us, a God who came in the person of his Son to die instead of all of us so that we might have the possibility of freedom from sin and a place in heaven with him.

BARTON MILLS BAPTIST CHURCH



November 11th is the day we remember to give thanks for all those men and women who sacrificed so much during the two World Wars and other conflicts since. We remember them with gratitude as it gave each one of us the freedom we enjoy in our country today.

How good is your memory? Having worked on the base for 63 years I have met countless people from all over the world. Often they return to the UK, on business or vacation and it's good to renew acquaintance, however, it is getting increasingly more difficult for me to remember their names. I prided myself on remembering each one of them and their children's names but now it's not so good. Although forgetfulness increases with age, it's really common to everyone. Even children have lapses of memory, how often have you heard a child say "I forgot". In a world of cell phones and speed dialing, our ability to remember may be short-circuited by reliance on technological gadgets.

Letting a phone number slip our minds or to forget a face is trivial, but keeping a mental grip on God's Word is of the utmost importance. Many years ago now my father was losing his sight, he gave thanks daily that early in life he had been taught in both Sunday and Day school to remember portions of Scripture. It was part of their weekly lessons to learn texts from the Bible and to recite them publicly.

A former founder of the "Navigations Ministry in America" said that the three principles of Scripture memory are: Review! Review! Review! He urged memorizing the reference with text and believed that anyone who learned a verse and reviewed it daily for seven weeks would never forget it. The goal of etching Scripture in our minds is to have it fill our hearts and motivate our actions. Memorizing opens the mental door to God's Word. Review gives it a permanent home in our hearts. Don't leave it too late, there may come a day when you can't see to read God's Word or you find it difficult to remember.

The Psalmist said, "Thy Word I have hid in mine heart that I might not sin against Thee", "I will meditate in Thy precepts, and have respect unto Thy ways" and "I will not forget Thy Word" all these wonderful verses are found in the longest Psalm 119, verses 11 and 15-16.



Norma Howell was our speaker on the subject of Medical Detection Dogs. This remarkable charity was founded in 2008 in Milton Keynes. Approximately 30% of a dog's brain is dedicated to analysing odour – far superior to us mere humans. The cost of training a dog, for example a Medical Alert Assistance Dog, is a staggering £29,000. Norma explained how the dogs are trained in the detection of Cancers, Neurological diseases & Malaria amongst others. It takes 4-6 months to train a dog.

A very interesting talk – at which a total of £125.00 was raised by our members.


