Vicar's Letter

Dear friends

This month sees a huge adventure for me as I embark on a trip to Ethiopia with Christian Aid to see in person the effects of the worldwide climate crisis, what local people are doing about it and some projects to help people find solutions. This opportunity has arisen through my 'other' job as the Bishop's Environment Officer, and the expectation is that it will give me lots of stories to tell on my return about the importance of serious action to combat this threat to Planet Earth.

I've been asked a good question about all this: why, if I am so worried about global overheating and the impact of overuse of fossil fuels, I think I can justify FLYING to Ethiopia. Well, it's an excellent point. I'll be responsible for the burning of a lot of aviation fuel. The rationale is that the biggest need for the western world right now is to wake up to the seriousness of the situation; and if I can help to spread that message far and wide when I get back, it will be worth the damage done by going. Also, I will of course be 'carbon-offsetting', i.e. planting trees to do at least as much good to the environment as the harm I will be doing by flying.

Ethiopia is an amazing country, which has responded to the changing climate in many positive ways, such as generating enough renewable energy to power the whole country without needing any fossil fuels at all, and even to export it to neighbouring countries. Despite being the most populous country in Africa, with the fastest growing economy, they have set an ambitious target to become carbon neutral within the next five years – way ahead of more developed nations like our own. They have pledged to plant a staggering 4 billion trees this year, and have already set a world record by planting 350 million in one day, granting many workers a day off to take part. On a more local level, there are lots of ingenious schemes for instance to recycle old tyres to make durable footwear.

We are used to the idea that the rich, developed west can show developing countries a thing or two about technology and in general, "how things are done". I suspect visiting Ethiopia, where climate change is a daily reality, will be quite a humbling experience, as we begin to understand how far we in the west are lagging behind.

Expect to hear much more about this in the coming months!


The Davies Charity

THE PARISH COUNCIL

Barton Mills Parish Council hold public meetings every first Tuesday of the month at the Village Hall. At the meetings the members of the Parish Council, your councillors, discuss matters and agree important decisions as representatives of the residents of Barton Mills. Barton Mills Parish Council as other parish and town councils agree the annual precept, and this is collected from residents via your Council Tax that is paid to West Suffolk District Council.

Annually the Parish Council produce a budget which details how the Parish Council intends to spend the precept in the year. The budget includes items such as new street lights, street light energy and maintenance costs, the upkeep costs of the park and playing field, insurance fees, Remembrance Day Service ceremony, gardening and footpath clearance costs.

The Parish Council can also apply for funding from both the District and County Council to fund specific projects that helps or benefits the local community. Last year the Parish Council received funds from West Suffolk County Council to fund football coaching for children during the school holidays.

The clerk produces annual accounts which details all of the income and expenditure, and compares budget to actual figures. The accounts are audited both internally and externally and are available to view on the website or by contacting the clerk.

The Parish Council also carry out other activities which includes commenting on any planning applications to be considered, liaise with both the District and County Councillors regarding important matters, receive local police reports, move the SID (Speed Indicator Device) along with a volunteer resident and any other matters that arise.

The members of the Parish Council would like to encourage residents to attend the Parish Council meetings, in which you are given an opportunity at the start of the meeting to comment or ask questions on any item on the agenda.

This is an opportunity to see what your Parish Council does and to give your views and opinions on any Parish matters.

The agenda is both published in the notice boards around the village and on our website. If you are unable to attend a meeting, you can alternatively contact the Parish Council via the clerk or by contacting any councillor.

Next Parish Council Meeting

The next Parish Council meetings will be on **Tuesday 1st October and Tuesday 5th November 2019** at 7:30pm in the Village Hall. In the event of an extraordinary meeting being held before the next scheduled meeting, it will be published on the website and on the notice boards. The Public are welcome to attend Parish Council Meetings and will be offered the opportunity to speak at the beginning of the meeting or at the Chairman's discretion. BRAHMS REQUIEM

And The Armed Man

Brahms Ein deutsches Requiem
Karl Jenkins Suite from The Armed Man

This evening we perform two contrasting choral works, one an acknowledged masterpiece, the other a contemporary classic. Brahms began work on his sublime German Requiem following the death in 1856 of his close friend and fellow composer, Schumann, A notoriously slow and self-critical worker. Brahms only completed it a decade later, after the death of his mother, when he added in tribute to her a movement featuring a soprano soloist. Following the example of the seventeenth century composer Heinrich Schultz, Brahms chose as the texts for his German Requiem traditional words of comfort for the bereaved from the Lutheran Bible rather than using the Catholic Latin mass. The result is a work that acknowledges personal suffering and grief and attempts to offer consolation. Originally conceived for two soloists, choir and large orchestra, Brahms himself made a transcription of the orchestra's role for piano, four hands. It is this intimate, chamber music-like account of Brahms's great score that we perform this evening.

Commissioned for the millennium and dedicated to the victims of the Kosovo crisis, Karl Jenkins's The Armed Man is a powerful and compelling account of the descent into the horrors of war before offering hope for a peaceful future. The work has captured the popular imagination to become one of the most performed and poignant choral works of the moment. We perform the composer's five-movement choral suite, which distils many of the piece's most striking elements.




