Vicar's Letter

Dear friends

When I was about 8 or 9 years old my glamorous older sister flew out on holiday to Spain with some friends. It all seemed so exotic and exciting back in the 60's, when package holidays made trips overseas so much more accessible to ordinary people like us. On that occasion though, the most exciting part about it for me was getting up before dawn to welcome my sister home. She had brought presents for all the family, and for me there were some flip-flops with colourful plastic flowers adorning the toes. I put them on immediately (of course) and ran outside into the garden to try them out. The sun had not yet risen but there was a glimmer of light, and there were birds beginning to sing in the spinney behind our house. As I stood with my feet in the damp grass and the light grew, the chorus of birdsong got louder and louder until I was almost deafened by my first magnificent experience of the dawn chorus, when every bird welcomes the daylight with its loudest singing.

I think that was the moment when my love of nature was born. As I grew older, I often used to get up before first light and wander the beautiful countryside around our house identifying different birds, spotting all kinds of small creatures and learning about trees and flowers. Over the years my love of creation became intertwined with my love for God, and so it remains today. Isn't it strange that this love affair began with polluting air travel and plastic flip-flops — God really does move in mysterious ways!

The Bible tells us that "The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands" (Psalm 19) and describes how he is praised by "great sea creatures and all ocean depths ... mountains and hills, fruit trees and cedars, wild and domestic animals, small creatures and flying birds." (Psalm 148) No wonder that being amongst nature is so uplifting – everything we see and hear around us is part of an unending song of praise. Increasingly we realise how important it is to protect and care for this planet we call home – not just for our own benefit, but because God loves it.

As we move into Autumn my prayer is that you will find joy in colourful leaves, misty mornings and sparkling frosts even as we continue to cope with these strange times.

HARVEST FESTIVAL, SUNDAY 18th OCTOBER. HARVEST HATS

As you will have seen on the church services page, Harvest Festival Sunday will be 18th October. Usually, in preparation for this, we would be asking for gifts of food for the Mildenhall Food Bank, and for people to decorate the church with fruit and vegetables and flowers.

But because of Covid-19, things are different. Instead of asking for gifts of food we are asking for gifts of money which will be given to the Food Bank for them to purchase necessary food. Details on the other page.

And, instead of decorating the church, which is not permitted, it has been suggested that we could decorate ourselves, by wearing **HARVEST HATS!** So, do come to the service at 9.30am on Sunday 18th October, and, if possible, wear a HARVEST HAT, i.e. any old hat suitably decorated to celebrate Harvest. Despite these difficult times, we do still have much to be thankful for.



A BRIEF HISTORY of BARTON MILLS

Archaeology in 1923, at Chalk Hill near the village, showed finds of cremation burials, a pottery urn, and a bone necklace, all dating from the Bronze Age. Previous excavations here, in 1869, found similar burials and 'Beaker' pottery.

The Domesday Book (1086) shows that there were 22 households; these were under the control of two Tenant Owners. They were Richard son of Count Gilbert, who had 1 freeman, 8 smallholders and 1 servant/slave; and William of Vatteville who had 7 villagers and 5 smallholders.

The Church of St. Mary is medieval; it has a 13th century doorway and a 14th Century tower. There was much rebuilding work done in 14th Century, and later it was 'restored' in Victorian times.

Street Farmhouse, which has timber framing and jetted upper floors, dates from about 1500.

Grange Farmhouse has 16th Century origins with various additions throughout later centuries. The farmhouse stands on the site of the Grange of Barton Parva, which was held by Bury St. Edmunds Abbey from the 13th or 14th Century, until the Dissolution of Monasteries.

Other properties date from the 16th and 17th Centuries. One of these is the timber framed and thatched, Lord Mayor's Cottage, which stands on the probable site of Sir Henry Barton's house. He was the Lord Mayor of London from 1416 to 1428.

The Bull Inn dates from the 18th Century. It is known that Queen Victoria stayed here just before succeeding to the throne.

In 1732, the 2nd Earl of Oxford described a tiring journey across the Fens to reach Barton Mills, but was pleased to find that his onward journey to Bury St. Edmunds was easily navigable on the River Lark!



BARTON MILLS BAPTIST CHURCH



Recently myself and many older friends, have become increasingly anxious when visiting shops for the first time after the lifting of the original lockdown. Fear for our children, who are not afraid of what lies ahead, and fear for older members who grew up in a society where the doors to our homes never needed to be locked but were always open to anybody for chats and a cup of tea. In this fragile world, where the most solid institutions of our land are going "under", we are only human and have cause to fret! Our TVs and newspaper headlines constantly remind us to be fearful of job losses, and now the dreaded loss of life from the current flu virus. What then for the future?

Before we fall under the weight of our accumulated fears, we would do well to look back to a 20th century woman who bore sadness, pain and heartache with grace. Corrie Ten Boom lived through the hellish life of Nazi concentration camps – a place where hope was lost for most people. She survived to tell her story of unfaltering faith and tight fisted hope in God. She saw the face of evil up close and personal. She saw some of the most inhumane acts man can do to man. And when she came out of it all, she said this "If you look at the world, you'll be distressed, if you look within, you'll be depressed, BUT if you look at Christ, you'll be at rest". Where are you looking? Are you focusing on the world and its dangers? Are you gazing at yourself, hoping to find your own answer, or are you looking to Jesus the author and finisher of your faith? (Hebrews 12 v 1-2).

Fear is a powerful emotion, it can make grown men seem like frightened children. God not only understands this, but He is also very patient with us as He develops in us the faith that overcomes fear. The Lord can use our fears to develop our faith. To those who put their trust in Him He has promised never to leave nor forsake (Hebrews 13 v 5) and we have more assurance in His word that if we acknowledge Him in all our ways, He will direct our paths. (Proverbs 3 v 6). In verse 4 of Psalm 23 we read "Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death I will fear no evil for Thou art with me, thy rod and thy staff they comfort me." To the child of God learning to trust in His care and goodness, our fears will bring renewed assurance that He is always there.

We hope to reopen the Chapel, D.V., at 3 p.m. on Sunday 27th September. Times and Dates of future services will be displayed on the notice board at the Chapel.

VACANCY ON THE PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council have a vacancy arising following the resignation of Clir Garry Flack. A Notice of Vacancy has been published accordingly and an election will be held if requested by more than 9 electors, otherwise the Parish Council can fill the vacancy by co-option. This has not been determined at the time of printing and therefore will be confirmed on the website and Facebook.

If the vacancy can be filled by co-option, this will be at the meeting scheduled 3rd
November 2020.

To be considered for co-option applicants must be at least 18 years of age and a Commonwealth or EU citizen, and must meet one of the following criteria:

- Be registered as a Local Government Elector for the Parish on the current Electoral Register.
- Has during the whole of the previous 12 months occupied as tenant or owner any land or other premises in the Parish.
- Has had his/her principal or only place of work in the previous 12 months in the Parish.
- Has resided either in the Parish or within 3 miles thereof during the previous
 12 months

In the event of a co-option, anyone wishing to be considered for the vacancy should contact the Clerk to the Council, in writing by 24th October 2020, confirming that they meet the eligibility criteria and stating why they wish to join the Parish Council. Should more than one application be received for the vacancy, councillors will decide

the appointment by a vote, or series of votes, in order to obtain a majority decision.


BARTON MILLS WEDNESDAY CLUB All Over 50s Welcome

Good Neighbour Scheme

-looking forward

Since the September edition of the Barton Miller, the Scheme has received a number of requests from villagers seeking assistance with the types of tasks that represent a move towards the normality that existed pre-COVID-19.

The absence of the such requests during the period of lockdown and shielding meant that the focus of the Scheme was very much centred on shopping and prescription collection, for which a corps of dedicated volunteers readily and willingly provided their services to meet. The potential for a degree of normality to return to the Scheme will hopefully enable more of our volunteers to offer their skills and time to meeting other types of requests for assistance, alongside the continuation of the shopping and prescription collection services that we have always offered.

The Good Neighbour Scheme is not just about one-off tasks but also offers regular chats by telephone or face-to-face (when times and COVID-19 restrictions permit) between our volunteers and villagers experiencing isolation and loneliness. Such contacts have already brought about new friendships and reduced loneliness amongst those for whom the Scheme has met their needs.

Each December, the Good Neighbour Scheme has held a Coffee Morning on a pre-Christmas Saturday in the Village Hall. These Coffee Mornings have raised considerable funds for the Scheme to meet its financial needs but more importantly they have been great social events that have brought villagers together over teas, coffees and delicious cakes. In these uncertain times it is difficult to plan for a 2020 event but it remains under review at this time and we will try to publicise it sufficiently in advance if we are able to hold it this year.

A Curious Papal Connection to Barton Mills?

There is a reference to the document: 'List of Rectors with Sundry Documents relating to Church Matters at Barton Mills', written by Edgar Powell in 1907. His document only inferred that in the 13th Century, Jacobus de Scabellis was a non-resident rector of this parish. However, Edgar Powell was correct in identifying Scabellus as the man who became a Pope.

Internet research reveals that Giacomo Savelli, who took the Latin name Jacobus de Scabellis, was the son of a Senator from a wealthy and influential family in Rome. He studied at the University of Paris, and had funds from various sources. Scabellis rose to the status of a Cardinal, and by 1285 he became Pope Honorius IV. It is recorded that when he was Pope, he relinquished the benefice of 'Berton' in the Diocese of Norwich.

No records of this Berton or Barton in the Norwich Diocese's history have yet been found. Nor any direct evidence of Barton Mills (or Barton Parva as it was once known) being within the diocese of Bury St. Edmunds Abbey until the following century!




