

Vicar's Letter

Thank you for your example of Christian love and hope

What an extraordinary time we have had over the last 10 days! Whilst we all knew that at the age of 96, HM Queen Elizabeth II would die before too long, when it happens it is still a shock not least to her family. Much has been said of her life of duty and service to the nation and the commonwealth but there has also been a focus on her Christian faith and the impact that it has had on her whole life. She has spoken of her faith in many of her Christmas broadcasts. It has been obvious, even to those of other faiths and none, how much that faith has influenced her whole life and we have seen this in her interactions with people from all walks of life, from presidents and prime ministers to the many thousands whose encounter with her has been at one of the palace garden parties, to the many staff who worked for her. Her care for people and the way she made them feel at ease has been something which will not be forgotten by those who met her.

In amongst all that has been said in these last few days one story I hadn't heard before is from the Queen's Coronation Service in 1953. In a service of such pomp and ceremony at which she would accept the role and burden of being the Queen of this nation and all the Commonwealth and be subjected to the expectations of all those people, before dedicating her life to this work she insisted on first going to kneel at the rail before the altar at Westminster Abbey and re-dedicating her life to God and his service. It was only then that she was ready to accept the role of Queen and all that that entailed.

We give thanks for the life of HM Queen Elizabeth II and particularly for her lifelong Christian witness of love and hope. May she rest in peace.

BARTON MILLS BAPTIST CHURCH



What a year this has been, especially the last few weeks. As I write this I am still in a state of shock at the news our wonderful Oueen, looking frail but still able to get about, two days later had passed away. It was indeed a very sad time for us as we came to terms with the fact we would see her no more in this life. Right up until that time her commitment and dedication to duty never waned. I know I used the following words in a previous Miller but decided they were worth repeating at this time. Her commitment and dedication to duty were wonderful, to my mind she did not put a foot wrong! At Christmas time her speeches to the Nation, and what's left of the Commonwealth, have proved that she was a lady ready to stand up for what she believed. From the moment she realized that one day she might be Oueen, she showed a very strong sense of duty and on her 21st birthday, the following was part of her speech to the Commonwealth: "I declare before you all that my whole life whether it be long or short shall be devoted to your service and the service of our great imperial family to which we all belong". The Queen had a deep rooted faith and in her Christmas Day television broadcast in 2000, she said: "To many of us, our beliefs are of fundamental importance. For me, the teachings of Christ, and my own personal accountability before God provide a framework in which I try to lead my life. I, like so many of you, have drawn great comfort in difficulties from Christ's words and example."

Sometimes we get lax in our commitment to follow the Lord, He wants us to be committed to His service not to get sidetracked by the enticing attractions of the world. We can admire the apostle Paul for his faithfulness and commitment to the Lord. He faced many difficulties: shipwrecks, imprisonments, beatings and other kinds of abuse, yet he was still able to say in 2 Timothy 4 v 7, as he neared the end of his life, "I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith". He looked forward to what the Lord had promised him as a result of this commitment. We too may falter and need to be restored. The only way to know the joy of Christ's approval is to give our lives fully and unreservedly to Him!

I am still coming to terms with the Queen's demise but am convinced that she has gone to be with the one whom she served during her 70 year reign and most of the 96 years she lived. We now pray the new King will follow in his mother's footsteps and come to know that same Saviour, the Lord Jesus Christ, whom she served and loved.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT SCHEMES



In view of the passing of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, we decided to go ahead with our Sept meeting. We began with a minute's silence, followed by the National Anthem.

Our Speaker, Stephen Papworth, told us of the wonderful work of the Cats Protection. He started by telling us all about the many types of cat both domestic and wild and their different characteristics and dispelled the myth that cheetahs can run at 70mph - 50 mph is more like it and black panthers are not truly black, you can still see leopard 'rosettes' through the black fur.

The work of the Cats Protection began in 1927 by Jesse Wade under the name of the Cats Protection League. It is dedicated to rescuing, and rehoming stray and unwanted cats and educating people about cats and cat welfare. They offer respite care for people who need a temporary home for their cats. Since its foundation it has rehomed over 1.5 million cats!! As a passionate cat owner himself, his knowledge of cats is extensive.



Hibernating hedgehogs. If you are fortunate enough to have one or more hedgehogs visiting your garden, feasting on slugs that might otherwise spoil your special plants, don't delay in providing suitable winter accommodation. Hedgehogs hibernate to cut down energy consumption to the bare minimum to stay alive. Piles of dead dry leaves, gaps under a log pile, under a compost heap, under thick hedges or bramble patches can all be a desirable residence for an over-wintering hedgehog. They carry leaves in the mouth, a few at a time, to the chosen site. When it has sufficient it burrows inside and shuffles round and round to create a small chamber with walls around 4 ins (10cm) thick.

"Your hedgehog" may also be regarded as "their hedgehog" by several neighbours so passage between gardens is very important A gap of 13cm diameter is regarded as sufficient.

If you are having a **bonfire** be sure to make absolutely certain that no hedgehogs are in residence before you light it.






