Vicar's Letter



Which season is your favourite? Is it the new life of Spring, the warmth and vibrancy of Summer, the fruitfulness and colour of Autumn or the brisk cold and dark nights of

Winter?

I love Autumn. I love the leaves turning with colours of flaming golds and oranges – that first coolness of the morning. I love the feel of leaves as you walk through them.

I am not a poet, so the words of the popular hymn "How Great Thou Art" express my feelings about walking through autumn landscapes "When through the woods, and forest glades I wander, And hear the birds sing sweetly in the trees. When I look down, from lofty mountain grandeur. And see the brook and feel the gentle breeze. Then sings my soul, My Saviour God, to Thee, How great Thou art, How great Thou art."

Barton Mills may not be well known for its mountain grandeur, but I feel just the same when I walk past the Lark or contemplate the fens – it brings me to thank God for his wonderful creation.

Our universe is so amazing – from the farthest reaches of the universe with its ancient galaxies, the pull of the massive black hole at the centre of our own galaxy, the rhythm of the seasons, the sight of fish swimming in the clear waters of the river, the intricacies of life under a microscope to the miracle of a newborn baby. I myself find it hard to believe we are already into October, three quarters of the year have already gone and on the 26th we will be putting our clocks back.

The following story conveys an important point on time. "A father once said he was trying to beat the clock to the office one morning when his 3 year old son asked him to stay and play with him. He said he was sorry but he was late for work and would see him as soon as he returned home. As he stood their winding his watch, the child said in all seriousness, "just change the numbers, Dad, then you'll have time".

How have we spent our time so far this year? Did we do anything worthwhile? How often have we wanted to "change the numbers" and "beat the clock". We put the important things off a little longer and say "Not now, but later, I've got plenty of time". We have good intentions but fail to respect the precious fleeting nature of time. We forget that the opportunities of life come only once. Proverbs 6 v 6 - 11 makes it clear that some things just shouldn't be put off, in spite of our best excuses. God expects us to make an effort to use His gift of time wisely before it's too late and we lose it altogether. Psalm 90 v 12 says "...teach us to number our days, that we may apply our hearts unto wisdom". In all of time and all of timeless eternity, "now" will never be repeated. Psalm 31 v 14 - 15 says "I trust in Thee, O Lord....my times are Thy Hand". Let's believe that and rededicate our lives afresh to the One who was willing to give His time by obeying His Father God and sacrificing His life that we might live life to the full and for evermore!

Report of September 2024 Meeting

Our Speaker was a return visit by Fran Saltmarsh and her topic was the 'History of the Wedding Dress' She told us that the idea of the bride wearing white didn't start until Queen Victoria, she wore white at her wedding to Albert and so many brides wanted to copy this fashion. Up until that time the bride would wear her finest clothes on her special day.

She talked to us about a famous wedding painting by Jan van Eyck dated 1434, known as the Arnolfini Portrait, showing a bride and groom dressed in their finest to show just how wealthy they were. Oranges can be seen in the portrait, a further sign that this was an extremely wealthy couple. They were dressed in the finest woollen cloth, with ermine trim.

Bridal gowns reflected the fashion of the day . Fran showed us pictures of crinolines, which got wider and wider, the wealthier you were, so much so that the bride could hardly move. The empire line of the Regency period saw some dresses made of silver tissue with silver trimming and pearls were used quite a lot. Later came the dropped waist of the 'flapper girl' and so as each fashion took over it was reflected in the bride's dress. She showed us photos of brides during WW2 where the bride had to make do with whatever she could get on coupons, usually a costume.

She brought along some dresses from her own family weddings, her mother's and her own and one she happened across in an auction sale that was in a suitcase. Many of our members had brought their own wedding albums and a few their wedding dresses.

Our next meeting will be on **Tuesday**, 8th **October at 2pm in the village hall** and our Speaker Celia Graham will tell us about "Working life at Ickworth House in the 1930s".

Good Neighbour Scheme – We are there to help when needed

Now that the summer holidays are behind us, minds start to turn to the next half of the year with the prospect of late autumn weather and the winter that follows. For many it will be a challenging time with the issues that we continue to see in respect of the cost of living, especially around food, housing-associated expenses and fuel (home and travel), and any outcomes arising from the Government's promised October Budget. For some it will be a period when families may be able to visit less often, leading to feelings of isolation and loneliness.

The Good Neighbour Scheme can provide support to those in our community who are feeling isolated, through our volunteers calling in for a chat on a regular basis. We are also able to put villagers in touch with other appropriate support organisations in cases where we are not equipped to provide specialist help. This is done through our links with a County-wide support network. We can also help with collecting shopping and prescriptions – see the full list of our services on offer in our advertisement in this edition of the Barton Miller.

Accessing medical appointments can be a challenge, especially those at a distance in Bury St. Edmunds and Cambridge. Whilst the Barton Mills Good Neighbour Scheme has not included transport in its list of services, we might be able to assist in helping those villagers, who are finding it difficult to reach such appointments, access suitable transport, Contact us to find out.

I would like to remind readers that our services, which are free of any charge, are designed to support villagers across the entire Parish of Barton Mills. 
