## Vicar's Letter

#### **Changes and Chances**

One of the loveliest services in the Church of England is Compline, or 'Night Prayer', a series of calming and peaceful readings and prayers to end the day and prepare for sleep. One of the prayers we sometimes use says this:

Be present, O merciful God, and protect us through the silent hours of this night, so that we who are wearied by the changes and chances of this fleeting world, may rest upon your eternal changelessness; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

I've been reflecting much on changes and chances recently, particularly as I have passed some significant personal milestones. It's 40 years since I came to faith in my early 20's, 30 years since I set out on the path to ordination and 25 years since I first wore a dog-collar. So much has changed since that memorable day, in the church and in my own life. It's also 7 years since I took responsibility as Parish Priest of Barton Mills and the other parishes in our group – 7 years which have passed quickly and which I have much enjoyed. With advancing years I find as many people do that time seems to pass faster and faster, while I myself get a little slower and achier! So the time has come for me to announce my retirement as Parish Priest, with my last service coming on 1<sup>st</sup> November. My sadly neglected garden and home look forward to this date with much anticipation!

What follows will be up to our Bishop in discussion with the parishes, but in the short term we are very lucky to have a strong ministry team made up of our two curates, Rev David and Rev Caroline Butcher, as well as a number of very experienced retired ministers, so the change should be fairly seamless. After a suitable pause, I will no doubt join the team of retired ministers! Rev Caroline is due to be ordained Priest on September 6<sup>th</sup> at 9.30am in a service which will be live-streamed from the cathedral – all are welcome to tune in on the cathedral website <a href="https://stedscathedral.org/">https://stedscathedral.org/</a>

As from the February AGM on Pancake Monday we are now independent of the Church Parochial Council. We will be holding an AGM in late November to elect Trustees for the year 2021 and to agree accounts. At the moment of course we cannot be sure as to whether the meeting can be held physically in the Church, Church Room or Village Hall, but a decision will be made nearer the time depending on current Covid 19 regulations.

PLEASE consider Joining the TRUST, if you are not already a member, and getting involved, as we continue to maintain this wonderful asset to our community, St Mary's Church, Barton Mills. We use it for many Community Functions as well as for church services.

#### Maintenance work in the church:

New boiler: Boiler work has been completed and the boiler with all the switch gear is working well. We thank all those who attended fundraising functions as well as those who donated monies towards this project, including the 100 Club who gave a generous donation.

<u>Church Clock.</u> The bell striker is worn and needs urgent repair and re-building. The costs are to be shared by Parish Council who contribute every year towards the maintenance of the Clock, the Preservation Trust Charity and the 100 Club who have agreed to make another generous donation. PLEASE BE AWARE that when this work starts, in the autumn, the Striker will be out of action so there will be NO Hourly strikes etc from the clock until this work is completed.

**Electrical wiring:** Another major project for the coming year is that the Church wiring needs urgent attention and will be costly. We will keep the Villagers informed and really do ask for your involvement and support!

## BARTON MILLS BAPTIST CHURCH



First let me apologize for this very **personal testimony** of my life during the past few weeks. One day during the self isolation period and lock down, whilst reading the portion set aside for that day, I was made aware not to sit and feel sorry for myself but to "Get Up and Go", "Keep Calm and Carry on". Excellent secular sayings which I am sure **encouraged** many of us during this still on-going **dramatic time** in our lives.

Also my Daily Bible Readings too were most apt and the portions of Scripture recommended were always very appropriate, ironically humanly planned before the pandemic. John 16 v 33 tells us: "These things have I spoken unto you that in Me ye might have peace. In the world ye shall have tribulation, But be of good cheer; I have overcome the world" and Psalm 55 v 22 reminds us to "Cast our burdens upon the Lord and He shall sustain us., He will never suffer the righteous to be moved".

Like the rest of the country for the first time in over 70 years I was unable to attend a public place of worship and so with a friend who had to self-isolate for an extended time, due to Type 1 diabetes and only a telephone for outside contact, we have a short service every Sunday, over the phone, each providing a reading and selecting a favourite hymn. Normally we are encouraged not to "....forsake the assembling of ourselves together" (Hebrews 10 v 25), however, these little events have been a great blessing to me and along with much support and encouragement from neighbours and friends we are getting through this very sad time!

These days have been trying for most of us but if we put our trust in the Lord Jesus Christ and consider the verses referenced above, He will be with us as promised in Hebrews 13 v 5, "...I will never leave thee nor forsake thee." How wonderful is that?

At the moment Services will be somewhat different at the chapel but notices will be displayed outside on the gate providing revised times. F. A. RUTTERFORD


## BARTON MILLS WEDNESDAY CLUB All Over 50s Welcome

March 2020 saw the spectre of the COVID-19 pandemic impacting upon the wellbeing of communities such as ours. As vulnerable or unwell residents prepared to shield and safeguard themselves from this insidious virus, Barton Mills' friendly and caring neighbours called upon those requiring support to ensure that they were able to receive shopping and medications when needed, as well as providing telephone support for chats to alleviate isolation.

The Good Neighbour Scheme became a hub for support requests and volunteers at the outset of this period and worked in conjunction with the Parish Council, St, Mary's Church and the Baptist Church to ensure that as wide a coverage as possible could be provided. We were also very fortunate to receive support from West Suffolk Council to cover any expenses that we might incur specifically as a result of the work that we do in this connection.

We received a good number of requests for support in the early stages of the self-isolating/shielding/lockdown period and a considerable number of new volunteers came forward to offer their services to support such neighbours, for which the Good Neighbour Scheme Committee wish to express their sincere and heartfelt thanks for their help. Volunteers have during this time continued to support the needs of the neighbours who they were initially asked to help and I feel that there has been a strengthening of neighbourliness in the village through such links and also in the community as a whole beyond the work of the Good Neighbour Scheme.






