#### Vicar's Letter

#### Dear Friends

As parish priest of 4 busy parishes, I couldn't possibly manage without the assistance of a wonderful team of co-workers and ministers of different kinds, some of whom have been faithfully serving here for many years before I arrived, others of whom have arrived on the scene more recently. This month I'd like to introduce to you David and Caroline Butcher who are a mix of both, having been active leaders in the churches for some years but now beginning a new ministry amongst us having been licensed as 'Readers' or licensed lay ministers last June. David and Caroline write:

"We moved here from the West Country in 1991. In 1995 Caroline's 8-year-old Goddaughter died suddenly. This hugely impacted Caroline largely due to the strength demonstrated by the child's mother who was a close friend and a committed Christian. Determined to find out where this inner strength came from, Caroline investigated Christianity by attending an Alpha course on Christian Basics and, in April 1996.

committed her life to Christ.

In the meantime David was quietly observing a change in Caroline and in November 1996 he also gave his life to Christ. Since that point, although their Christian walks have been independent, they are also very much linked. Within 12 months David was encouraged to give talks during services and Caroline took an active role in the Children and Youth Ministry. This led to them visiting various Youth and Family Christian Conferences and running a youth group together over the next 10 years.

In 2011 David and Caroline, encouraged by their vicar, signed up to a 12 month course called 'Growing Leaders', to help them to determine whether they had the skills and abilities to consider a leadership role within the church. After much prayer and consideration with close friends and family, they began training in 2013 to be Lay Readers, a ministry which particularly focuses on preaching, teaching and pastoral care,

and were licensed by the Bishop in June 2016.

Recently Caroline retired from fulltime employment and is now very keen to develop her role, which will soon include leading funerals. Her interests include long distance running, Pilates, golf and holidays in the sun; she is also kept busy providing support to

her elderly mother.

David is currently working four days a week as the Diocesan Safeguarding Advisor, helping to make churches in Suffolk safe places for children and vulnerable adults. His outside interests include his passionate support of Arsenal FC, playing golf badly and social media. He is also keen to develop his ministry and has a particular enthusiasm for pastoral encouragement, particularly the preaching and teaching aspects of the Lav Reader role. They both enjoy planning, preparing and delivering services across all 4 parishes of the Lark and Lee Group and also have an active role in the 'Open the Book,' a scheme which enables local people to act out bible stories in school assemblies."

If you meet David or Caroline in church or about the parishes, please do give them a warm welcome. We are very lucky to have them as part of our marvelous team.

#### Special Study Groups will be held in Lent on the theme of Life Attitudes – A Study of the Beatitudes



This series of studies examines a series of Jesus' sayings known as the Beatitudes. These sayings (part of the 'Sermon on the Mount',) in many ways encapsulate his teaching, and Jesus himself lived them out in his earthly life calling his followers to do the same.

These studies encourage us both to examine our own lifestyle in the light of Jesus' radical teaching and to dare to live out kingdom values – here and now. Each session takes a dual approach to studying the Beatitudes, on the one hand deepening our understanding of Jesus whilst challenging our deepest personal values; and on the other helping us understand how these teachings impact on our approach to major global issues, such as environmental pollution and the deep-seated hostilities and injustices that afflict our world.

Studies will be offered at a number of different times and locations across our 4 villages, so that everyone will have a chance to attend. We are also offering a Quiet Day at beautiful Clare Priory where we will be introduced to the theme.

Session 2 Living Openly – w/c 6<sup>th</sup> March

Session 3 Living Purposefully – w/c 13<sup>th</sup> March

I received numerous Christmas cards in December, however, very few of them portrayed the real reason for the season, the celebration of Jesus Christ's birthday, BUT one did, and I thought the words worth passing on.

IF our greatest need had been information, God would have sent us an educator. IF our greatest need had been technology, God would have sent us a scientist.

IF our greatest need had been money, God would have sent us an economist.

IF our greatest need had been pleasure, God would have sent us an entertainer.

## **BUT** our greatest need was forgiveness, so God sent us a Saviour!

A best man at his friend's wedding reception offered advice and encouragement to the newlyweds. In his speech he told of a football coach in a nearby town who, when his team lost a game, kept the losing score on the scoreboard all week to remind the team of their failure. The good news for us in 2017 is that Christ turns off the scoreboard when we fail. He came to earth to die for us and to forgive us our sins. He doesn't simply forgive when we repent, He removes our sin as far as the east is from the west (Psalm 103 v 12). With God, forgiveness means that our sin is out of sight.

Some of us have made wrong choices in our lives, but our past words and deeds need not define our future in God's eyes. When we ask for His forgiveness, we take a first step towards restoring our relationship with Him and with others. "If we confess our sins He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1 v 9). Let us thank God for not holding our sins against us and granting us a second chance.

#### Short Term Improvements on the A11

Major works are not expected to take place for at least 10 years and, in the meantime, some interim improvements are being investigated.

These include a feasibility study for putting traffic lights on the Fiveways roundabout, a review of speed limits on all roads surrounding it and the possibility of camera enforcement, and improvements to signage and road markings including signage to McDonalds.

The parish council has also requested a low noise road surface and improvements to the junction at Chalk Hill.

There are no plans to close the central reservation crossing points as part of the short term measures.

The results of the feasibility study for traffic lights and the review of speed limits are expected to be available in April, so watch out for more news on the A11 in the spring.

#### ARE YOU AWARE OF HOME ASSISTANCE GRANTS?

Funding is available from West Suffolk Councils to assist families/residents to make safe, repair and improve their homes.

We can assist in different ways, through Warmer Homes Healthy People or through the Home Assistance grant (HAG) to help home owners carry out repairs and improvements to their homes to ensure that they are warm, weathertight, safe and secure and have reasonably modern kitchen and bathroom facilities.

#### What type of works may qualify for a grant?

Works to remove serious health and safety hazards in the property.

Works to the structure of the property such as walls and external elements including roof covering and windows.

Internal services and amenities such as boilers, and electrics where they are in need of replacement or major repair are also included.

The provision of efficient heating systems and effective insulation where there is none.

In certain circumstances the improvement of old kitchens (over 20 years) and bathrooms (over 30 years) and improving internal layout.

Carry out minor adaptations to enable the owner to be discharged from hospital and reoccupy their home.

#### FIST BUMPS by Brian Crowder

Nearing mid-winter, we often see an increase in colds and flu left over from crowded gatherings of people at Christmas and New Year parties. These festive occasions are a happy hunting ground for spreading germs both airborne and through hand shaking. Door and shopping trolley handles are known to be harbingers of germs. Kisses are safer on the cheek than on the lips but shaking hands, especially for men who do more handshaking than women, is a dangerously unforeseen way of infecting a group of people.

St George's Hospital in London have notices displayed throughout reading "THIS IS A NO SHAKING HANDS HOSPITAL" and suggests "Fist Bumps". Why? Someone with a cold or in the early stages of real flu will be blowing their nose into a handkerchief or tissue which will transfer germs to the underside of their palms and fingers. With a cough or sneeze we mostly cover our mouths or noses with a semi-open hand making it infectious with plenty of germs on the palm and fingers waiting to be transferred to an almost unlimited number of hand shakers. The palm of the hand is a moist, warm incubator of germs unlike the outside of one's cool, dry fist.

Someone, perhaps in the medical profession, has thought up a way of greeting (to replace the risk of handshaking) which is known as the "Fist Bump". The theory is that there are far less germs, if any, on the outside of the closed fist. Several of my family and friends have used this method of greeting for a year or so and although handshaking is a time-honoured and friendly ritual, we have used the first bump and found that no-one objects and often say, "What a good idea!"




