Vicar's Letter

Dear Friends

A few days ago PM Theresa May announced a snap election in June, and in a rare show of unity the entire nation seemed to let out a loud groan. Not that we don't love democracy of course, but it's the prospect of weeks of wall-to-wall pundits dominating the news, politicians kissing babies and saying anything, anything at all in order to win our vote but with no intention of sticking to their word once in power, sound bites, photo opportunities, smear campaigns, and all so soon after the last lot. It's little wonder that many people have become cynical about the whole democratic process. I feel I should perhaps apologise for even mentioning it. But my excuse is that interestingly the PM and the leader of the opposition both released Easter messages urging us all to draw on Christian principles as we face the future. What can they mean?

May mentions compassion, community and citizenship, which she reckons she picked up during her vicarage upbringing. Corbyn for my money gets a whisker closer with social justice, peace and reconciliation. All nice things. It's hard to argue with any of it, but as both are quick to point out, people of other faiths and none are equally prone to have all those principles. They are basically just the principles of decent people everywhere. So why bother bringing up Christianity at all? Can we know how Jesus would have voted?

Jesus himself never got the opportunity to vote as he didn't live in a democracy, but in a country oppressed by a cruel invading force. He never openly opposed that force, though he did have a few choice words to say about hypocritical religious leaders; but clearly his teachings were seen as dangerous and subversive, so much so that the Romans feared an uprising, and executed him.

I think Jesus' problem with the electoral system might be that it tends to encourage selfishness: we look at the various manifestos and work out which will make us better off, not others. Why would I want to risk paying more taxes so that people I'll probably never meet can benefit? And so we have created a system in which everyone seeks their own best interests - the very opposite of what Jesus taught.

For the real thrust of Jesus' message was not just decent, vicarage style principles, but radical love for God alongside radical love for others. The kind of love that determinedly puts the needs of others before our own, goes on loving in the face of hatred, gives more than is asked and goes on giving till the pips squeak. The reality of Christian life, even in vicarages, even in churches, is one of struggle and weakness as we do our darnedest - and all too often fail - to live out those very simple principles. I doubt if you'll hear any politicians talking about that as they try to win your vote.

BARTON MILLS BAPTIST CHURCH



At this time of year we like to clean up our gardens and prepare them for the summer blooms, so much of it looks dead and we are tempted to dig them out and destroy them. However, if we wait a while and look closely we see new growth appearing on what we thought was dead wood. The seed potatoes we planted in March looked dead, however, in a few weeks' time, God willing, we should be digging up new potatoes which have been formed from those old lifeless ones we set earlier. Jesus Christ too had to die and be raised up from the dead and exactly on the 40th day after His resurrection, as the disciples watched in amazement, the Savior was "taken up and a cloud received Him out of their sight" (Acts 1 v 9).

Great emphasis is placed on Christmas (when Christ was born); Good Friday (when Christ was crucified); and Easter (when Christ was raised from the dead), but little attention is given to Ascension Day (when the risen Christ was taken up into Heaven to be with His Father in Glory). This year we shall be celebrating this occasion, Ascension Day, on the 25th of May. Many of us in Barton Mills commenced our education at St. Mary's in Mildenhall and as it was a Church school, on the morning of Ascension Day, we attended a service in the Parish Church. That service for us youngsters always revived our vivid imaginations, as we listened to the Rector explaining the Ascension of Jesus Christ when, at the end of His earthly ministry, He was taken up into Heaven. On the 40th day after the resurrection, having given His disciples final instructions. Jesus slowly ascended and a cloud hid Him from view. He had previously told them in John 14 v 2-3, "I go to prepare a place for you... I will come again, and receive you to Myself, that where I am, there ye may be also". They had been warned that He would leave them but I am certain the shock of His departure in this way caused the disciples to ponder on His promise to them, as recorded in Acts I v 11, "Ye men of Galilee, Why stand ye gazing up into Heaven? This same Jesus, which is taken up from you into Heaven, shall so come in like manner as ye have seen Him go into Heaven".

Jesus not only died, but He rose from the grave, went back to the Father and is interceding for us right now, best of all we are told that He is coming again! May this Ascension Day be a time for special rejoicing and thanksgiving to God, and a time for us to reflect on our preparation for His return.



Short Term Improvements to the A11

Highways England has been working with its consultants to explore the feasibility of a package of short term measures targeted at addressing congestion and delays at Fiveways and safety concerns on the A11 immediately south of the roundabout.

In March, the transport secretary announced £400,000 to be spent on a package of measures to address these concerns and it is anticipated that this funding will be sufficient to carry out all the measures which are identified as deliverable by Highways England.

Possible measures include traffic lights on all or some of the approaches to Fiveways, reduced speed limits at Fiveways and on the surrounding roads including on the A11 to the south of the roundabout, and camera enforcement of speed limits. Changes to signage and lane markings are also being considered including more effective signage to McDonalds.

Highways England is continuing to develop its proposals and we expect to hear further news in June.
