
BARTON MILLS WEDNESDAY CLUB All Over 50s Welcome

Are you interested in PRISON VISITING?

Highpoint Prison is in need of a few volunteers to visit prisoners.

The prisoners who ask for visitors are usually people who have no family or the family live too far away to visit or the family just don't visit. The purpose of visiting is simply to talk with the person and offer non-judgemental friendship. Visitors cannot act on behalf of prisoners in any way.

You would join a team of eleven existing visitors and receive training. The Prison Chaplaincy runs the Visiting Programme but there is no religious element to visiting. Proselytising is forbidden. I have been visiting at Highpoint for fifteen years. It can be rewarding and also frustrating but it is invariably worthwhile.

Highpoint is about fifteen miles from Mildenhall and travel expenses are paid. It is an all male prison. If you are interested please contact me by phone or email and we can have a chat to see if you would like to investigate further.

An hilarious evening, and all took part with gusto.




