Vicar's Letter

Dear Friends

As the weather becomes more autumnal and nights begin to draw in, I'm reminded that in a few weeks it will be my birthday. All through my childhood falling leaves and misty mornings gave me that unmistakeable feeling of excitement. Soon there would be presents, and joy of joys, a party with my friends from school. I used to look forward to the party so much, because it fell near enough to November for my dad to be able to buy fireworks. He would build an enormous bonfire, we would drink hot chocolate and eat potatoes that had been baked in foil in the embers, and 'ooh!' and 'aaah!' at the roman candles, silver fountains and Catherine wheels. I have never forgotten the colourful sparks and lovely gunpowder smells. However, it all came to an end when my dad heard about some children who had been injured by fireworks, and my bonfire birthday parties were no more. Sad for me, but looking back I'm glad he cared so much about our safety.

Nowadays, perhaps because of the firework injuries, the major autumn fun for children seems to revolve around Hallowe'en, a seemingly safer option (though I have personally sustained injuries when trying to carve 'Jesus is the Light of the World' into a large pumpkin). Dressing up and doing craft activities is always fun, but I have to admit I'm not a fan of filling children's minds with thoughts of scary things, or of encouraging them to take sweets from strangers for that matter. I get the argument that dressing up as ghouls or monsters helps them to work through their imaginary fears, but it seems to encourage thoughts of normal things being scary too. For instance I saw in one supermarket, amongst the Hallowe'en costumes and masks, signs saying 'To the Graveyard' in 'spooky' writing. Our church is of course set in a graveyard, and people often comment to me how peaceful and beautiful it is. When it holds our loved ones it becomes not only beautiful but sacred. Why would we want to encourage the idea that it is scary?

So as Autumn begins to draw in do enjoy whatever celebrations you have,

but I hope that they are full of light and life rather than dark spookiness – and that all in our community will stay safe, with or without fireworks!

Last month I was blessed to travel to the USA. I was very excited at the prospect as I was to attend a wedding. The bride was the daughter of a Captain serving in the same Squadron as me, 23 years ago. She was born in the Lakenheath Base hospital and then when she was 2 months old they returned to the US. Now 23 years later she is once again in England, this time doing her own service for her country as a 1st Lt. That coincidence gave me the opportunity to be invited to her wedding which really has nothing to do with this item apart from the fact I had to travel nearly 4,000 miles to be there. During that time I proved that Angling is not now the largest participant and most popular sport in Britain, I think another claim to fame for the great British public is our ability to "queue". We are so good at it, we would win hands down if the Olympic Committee ever thought of making it a qualifying event. I witnessed so many queues during my travels, at the bus stop, in the airport, at the restaurant and even for the reception at the wedding venue. Much of our time is spent in waiting!

The 21st century is the age of the instant. We can make coffee, cook a meal and even telephone overseas in less than a minute. We have become accustomed to immediate results. Perhaps that's why we now find it difficult to wait for anything. As Christians we often find it difficult to wait on the Lord. Psalm 37 v 7 tells us to "Rest in the Lord, and wait patiently for Him. The best antidote for anxiety and distress is trusting in God and waiting patiently for Him. He never comes too late with the help we need. Waiting for the Lord can transform us into a people of growing faith. King David spent many years waiting to be crowned king and fleeing from Saul's wrath. David wrote in the Psalm 27 v14 "Wait on the Lord, be of good courage and He shall strengthen your heart". In another Psalm 40 v1-2 he encourages us with these words, "I waited patiently for the Lord, and He inclined to me and heard my cry, He....set my feet upon a rock, and established my steps." David grew into a "man after God's own heart by waiting on the Lord.

To wait does not imply we are lethargic or lazy but breathes the attitude of patience. It expresses dependence upon God and brings quietness to the soul. Patience means awaiting God's help without doubting God's love. Are you facing insurmountable problems? Do you feel that you are on the precipice of panic? Then, call to mind that our Heavenly Father "acts for the one who waits for Him" (Isaiah 64 v 4).



BARTON MILLS WI - NEWS AND INFORMATION

Report of August Meeting. This month our Speaker was Mandy Cox-Osborne, Royal British Legion Community Fundraiser for Suffolk. The poppy is such a familiar thing to us and Mandy told us of some of the valuable work done by the organisation to those serving and who have left the services. It was formed in 1921 and aims to support with welfare, comradeship, representation and remembrance. Money is raised in many ways. We are coming to the time of year when the Poppy Appeal volunteers will be a familiar sight in Supermarkets. The 'Poppy Appeal' year goes from 1st October one year to 30th September the following year and raises nationally on average £45 million. There are corporate and mass events throughout the year to raise funds. Poppies are no longer made by hand, except 'special ones' such as those laid by the Royal Family and dignitaries. They are also sold in Canada, Germany and Cyprus. She touched briefly on the help and care given to injured service men and women – financial, social and help for the family at difficult times.

We ended the evening by making our own poppy as a reminder of our talk and to buy our poppy when the time comes. Cheryl Stokes, a local lady who is extremely talented had prepared everything for us — we could make a badge, a flower for a vase or a fridge magnet. We all enjoyed the activity very much.

APPLE APPEAL.....

Our speed indicator display records the speed of passing vehicles and we have now analysed the results from the first couple of months.

In Worlington Road, within the 30mph limit, two thirds of vehicles are doing more than 30mph and about one in eight is doing over 40 mph. Sadly, a significant number of vehicles are being driven at over 60 mph. This information resulted in the police carrying out a speed check and five drivers are being prosecuted.

Speed is less in Church Lane where 78% of vehicles are travelling at below 30 mph. Just 1% are travelling at over 40 mph. However, regretfully, the maximum speed recorded was 58 mph.

In Mildenhall Road, 95% of vehicles are travelling at less than 30 mph. 18 vehicles were recorded as travelling at over 40mph and 3 at over 45 mph. The maximum speed recorded was 48 mph.

We hope that our SID will help to remind drivers of their responsibilities to the community and encourage safe driving throughout Barton Mills.

A NEW ROLE for our Phone Box

The phone box outside The Bell is the original one, of the K6 design, which was installed there in 1937. However, it is now



redundant, the phone has been removed and ownership has been transferred to the Parish Council. It is currently being renovated and, in its 80th year, it will soon have a new role as the home for a defibrillator. A phone for emergency calls only will also be installed.

BT has provided the paint and will continue to provide the electricity supply. Other costs are generously being met in memory of Tony Morley who lived in Barton Mills all his life.

When an appropriate call is made to the emergency services, the caller will be told where the nearest defibrillator is and will be given the code to access it. The defibrillator provides spoken instructions and no previous experience is needed to use it. However, a charity, The Community Heartbeat Trust, will be providing a training session locally for those who would like to feel confident.

We expect that this life saving facility will be available in our village very soon.

HOUSING NEED IN BARTON MILLS

Thank you to the 114 residents who responded to our Housing Need Survey earlier this year. The results have now been analysed and the Parish Council have received the final report.

The survey identified 22 current residents in housing need and a further 15 with a local connection who would like to return to the village, forming 23 potential households in all. These are mainly single people and couples who would like to set up their own home here. They would like one or two bedroom homes in a mix of tenures.

Only three of the respondents indicated that they were registered on Home-Link but there are currently 10 people registered who have indicated a local connection to Barton Mills, so this suggests some additional need.

It is concluded that ideally 10 to 15 affordable homes should be provided and Hastoe Homes are starting discussions with all interested authorities.

Could you offer a site?

A suitable site of about 1 acre needs to be identified. If any landowner would like to offer a site for consideration, which should be outside but near to the settlement boundary, please contact the parish clerk on 07712 232920, clerk@bartonmills.net. The market value will be paid.




